

Dover High School student earns top honor in Scouting

DOVER Eric Telle of Boy Scout Troop 95, chartered to St. Joseph Church, was awarded the rank of Eagle Scout at a recent Court of Honor.

Telle, the son of Doug and Ann Telle of Dover, is a senior at Dover High School and Buckeye Career Center. He is the troop's 26th Eagle Scout.
