

Shenango, Joy award scholarships

John Bienko, one of Dover High's four valedictorians in the 1984 graduating class and son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Bienko of 720 Gibbs Ln., has been awarded a scholarship by Joy Mfg. Co.

The scholarship is valued at \$1,400 per year for four years. There were 83 applicants corporate-wide, with 12 scholarships being awarded.

Bienko, whose father is a 20-year employee of Joy's New Philadelphia Division and manager of fan marketing, will attend the University of Notre Dame, majoring in aerospace engineering. Notre Dame's board of regents has designated him as a "Notre Dame Scholar," an honor presented to the top 20 percent of those being offered admission to the freshman class.

At Dover High, Bienko received letters of commendation from the governing boards of the Scholastic Aptitude Test program and the National Merit Scholarship testing program.

He is a member and current president of the National Honor Society and has participated in various school and community activities, including high school band, jazz band, dixeland band, track, student council, YMCA, church youth group and Little Theater orchestra.

Joy Mfg. has offered scholarships to children of its employees for about 30 years based on scholastic achievement as judged by a committee at the corporate office in Pittsburgh.

MEANWHILE, Jack W. Radcliffe, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jack D. Radcliffe of New Philadelphia, and Keith F. Shumaker, son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Shumaker of Dover, have been awarded \$6,000 college scholarships by the Shenango Co. of Dover.

Radcliffe will attend Mount Union College in Alliance next fall, where he will major in music. Shumaker plans to pursue a degree in computer science at Walsh College in Canton.

The scholarships will be paid in four annual installments of \$1,500 each and are awarded to children of Shenango employees on the basis of scholastic achievement, participation in extra-curricular activities and review by a selection committee.

This is the 29th year of Shenango's scholarship program.
