

Polk sets goal of \$6000 for Dollars for Scholars

A goal of \$6000 was set by newly-elected president John Polk as the Dover Dollars for Scholars launched its 11th year of assisting students last night.

Pledges totaling \$2000 were reported to Polk last night and he announced dates for two major fund-raisers, the annual telethon auction March 16 and a benefit bike-a-thon April 20.
