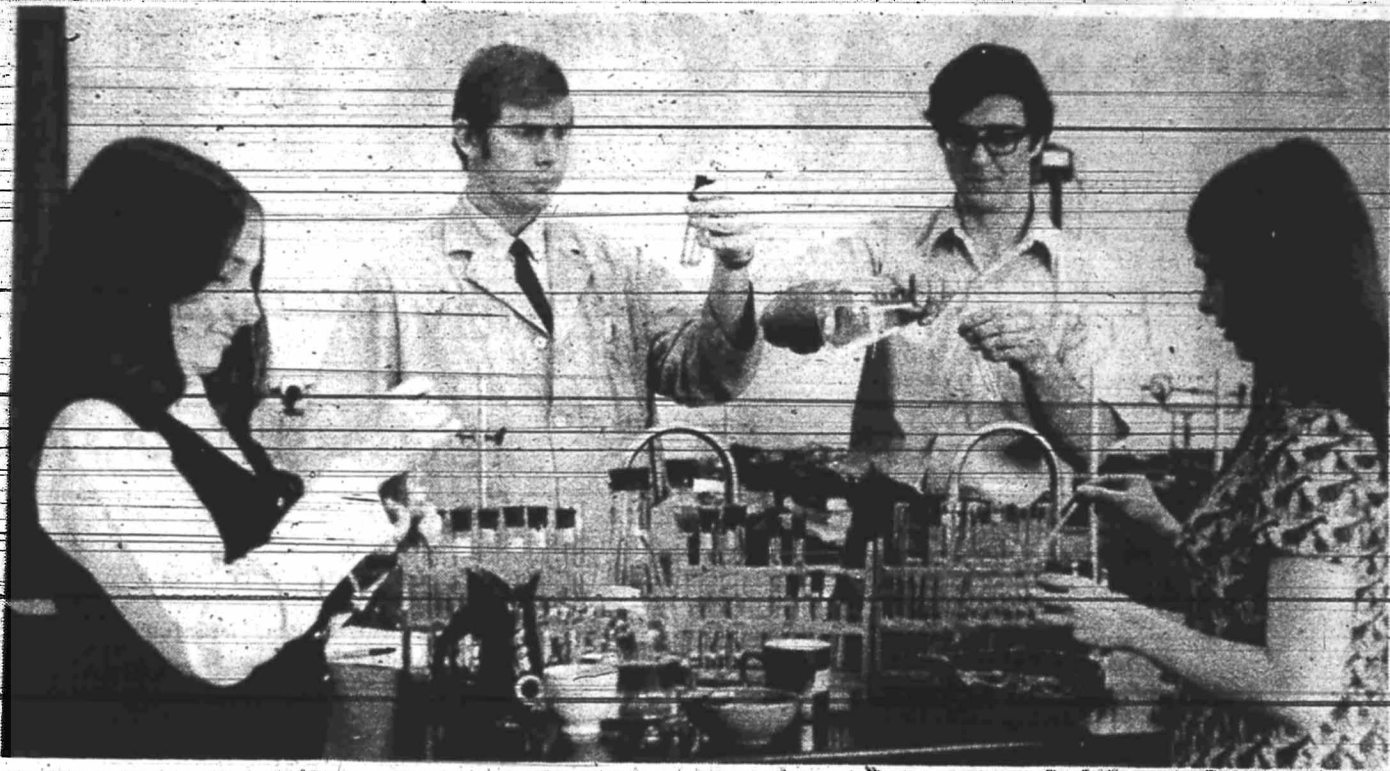


# Demonstration practice...
