

# Dover school budget up \$180,000

Dover school board Monday

night approved a \$2,902,567 budget appropriation for 1971, a \$180,000 increase over 1970.

Largest hikes are in instructional areas. Principals salaries increased from \$84,000 to \$98,000; teachers salaries increased from \$1,270,000 to \$1,374,000; textbook expenses were hiked to \$35,000 from \$13,000 and custodians' salaries were upped from \$87,000 to \$92,000.

The school system's operating fund was raised from \$2,259,707 to \$2,520,467, an increase of \$260,760.

Other appropriations with the

1970 expenditure in parenthesis are: Uniform school supply fund

\$18,000 (\$16,772), cafeteria fund \$130,000 (\$124,255), bond and interest fund \$199,600 (\$232,576), building fund \$0 (\$632), permanent improvement \$2,000 (\$4,048), federal funds \$12,500 (\$54,314), state auxiliary O.D.E. \$14,000 (\$23,198).

The board recessed at 9 and went into executive session to discuss the Ohio State University plan for the merger of Dover and New Philadelphia schools.

The New Philadelphia board passed a resolution in December requesting the issue be placed before the voters. The Dover

board must pass a similar resolution before it can be put on the ballot.

**In other action the board:**

**APPROVED** hiring Sheryl L. Legget and Douglas Willoughby, both of Dover, to teaching positions. Willoughby will be at East school.

**ACCEPTED** the resignation of Robert Schlater.

**VOTED** to join the revised Buckeye Joint Vocational School District and appointed Carl Pisocra to represent the board.

**APPOINTED** Wayne Kinsey, Cheryl Hammersley, Kathleen Vogel, and Peggy Walker to the substitute teacher list.

**DIRECTED** Supt. Bill Kinner to explore the operation of a summer school program and report to the board.

**APPROVED** the following personnel to attend professional workshops: Howard Dennison, Kent area pupil personnel conference; Herbert Garber, science education conference; Lois Armstrong and Glen Groh, cooperating teachers meeting; Darvl

Badertscher, Josephine Longer, Ruth Rausch, Danelle Fait, Betty Angel, and Geraldine Newall, east central Ohio special education program; Robert Wise and Dave Pierce, high school track coaches clinic; Charles Wilson, OASSP junior high principals conference.

Don Marshall, Daryl Badertscher, Wayne Reese and Glen Groh, elementary principals conference, Margaret Jones, Florence Toomey and Walter Heck, music education convention, and Clifford Schrader, national science teachers meeting.
