Dover school budget pegged at \$2,759,406

A proposed balanced budget of \$2,759,406 for 1972 was presented by Supt. Bill Kinneer at last night's meeting of the Dover board of education.

Kinneer stated: "These are the needs as I see them. Much will depend upon the state legislature. If we do not get the anticipated funds the outgo will of course have to be less."

SOME TIME WAS spent discussing the need to reseal and repair black-topped areas at the schools and installation of a fence at Dover Avenue Elementary. No decision was made.

Mrs. Isabel Moore, president, was named the board's delegate to an Ohio School Board meeting in November at Cleveland and Carl Pissocra was named alternate.

In other business board members:

-ACCEPTED Kinneer's recommendation to employ the following teachers:
Beverly McHenry, Neil Buchanan, Karen Armstrong, Marlene Maelachlan, Wilma Kimble and Russ McGlothin.
Kinneer noted this leaves only one vacancy to be filled to complete the teaching staff.

—APPROVED extra-curricular assignments for Lois Miller for four weeks in the vocational home economics department and Floyd May as student council advisor.

—ACCEPTED the resignations of Kris Nixon and Sherill Struchen.

-APPROVED granting a diploma to Lance Johns on his completion of summer school courses.

—APPROVED renewal of membership in WVIZ's school services for the 1971-72 year at a cost of \$1813 based on \$1 per elementary pupil and 50 cents per kindergarten pupil.

-AWARDED student accident insurance to the Personal Service Insurance Co. of Columbus. Floyd Burris of Bolivar is agent for the firm and was the only one to present figures to the board. Rates are \$12 for 24-hour accident insurance, \$4 for school accident insurance with a premium of \$15 for football insurance.

—APPROVED attendance at professional meetings for Supt. Kinneer, Charles Wilson, junior high principal, and Eleanor Armstrong, Daryl Badertscher, Barbara Smith, Glen Groh and Connie Lahr.

—AGREED to rent Crater Stadium to Central Catholic High for football games Oct. 2 and 9 and Nov. 6.
