

# Dover board has private hearing for lawyer and dismissed teacher

Routine matters and an executive session occupied the Dover board of education Monday night.

The executive session was requested by Atty. Andrew Hutyera, representing Jesse Reese, a teacher whose contract was not renewed at the board's last meeting.

The attorney was granted his request for the private hearing which took place immediately after the regular meeting.

Hutyera reported after the session that no action was taken by the board.

A representative of East School PTA asked who was responsible for repair of playground equipment and also said teachers at East School had complained that the ditto machine was not working. She was advised that these were matters which should be presented by the school's principal and was assured they would be given attention.

Don Marshall, Park School principal, outlined plans for mini courses in which the 5th grade students will take part the last week of school.

Complete information on the classes, which have been held three years, will be sent to every parent. Supt. Bill Kinneer suggested that the information be given to the principals of the three other elementary schools with the possibility of offering them to other students.

Thomas Armstrong Jr. of Dover and Thomas James of Uhrichsville were appointed to the teaching staff for the 1973-74 school year and Armstrong was approved as assistant varsity football coach.

Thomas Daniels was named 8th grade football coach and Douglas Strickmaker, 7th grade football coach.

In other action taken at the recommendation of Supt. Kinneer the board:

—APPROVED the appointment of Paula K. Reed to the

substitute teaching staff.

—EMPLOYED Kenneth Wallick as a bus driver.

—ACCEPTED the resignations of Mrs. Tom (Karen) Armstrong Jr., a teacher, and Clarence Philabaum, custodian.

—APPROVED a list of 277 seniors for graduation pending successful completion of all requirements.

—SET the time and place of commencement for June 3 at Crater Stadium. It was noted that the rain date is June 4 and if it rains on this date the exercises will be held in the high school gymnasium.

—GRANTED a year's leave of absence to Janice Zurowski.

—ACCEPTED the Athletic Council's recommendation that the student accident insurance for the 1973-74 year be granted to Floyd Burris of Bolivar, representative for the Personal Service INS Insurance Co. of Columbus.

—GRANTED Ray Byer permission to use Crater Stadium for a Mid-America Bands concert July 26.

—APPROVED attendance at professional meetings for a number of members of the staff and administration.

—APPROVED the appointment of Francis Maus to the Dover Public Library board of trustees for a seven-year term. He replaces Mrs. John (Ruth) Cooley.
