

Kinneer contract extended

Supt. Bill E. Kinneer was given a vote of confidence Monday night as the Dover board of education extended his contract for three years and granted him a pay raise in keeping with the 4 per cent increase approved last month for the school system's employees.

Effective Aug. 1, his salary will be \$24,665.

Kinneer's present five-year contract was due to expire Aug. 1, 1975. He was hired in 1970 to replace Supt. Emmet L. Riley.

The board also approved Dover schools participation in Title Programs: Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) I, II and III, and National Department of Education Assistance (NDEA) III.

Don Peters, administrative assistant, explained that ESEA Title I funds would pay for the salaries of three special reading teachers. Peters said Title II funds are earmarked for library resources for elementary schools and Title III monies would reimburse the system for the cost of standardized testing at one grade level.

NDEA Title III funds would cover 50 per cent of the cost of instructional equipment on the elementary level.

In establishing the NDEA Title III fund, the board approved transferring \$1893 from the general fund and \$1893 from the general contingency fund. The latter amount, or 50 per cent, would be replaced by the federal government.

Board members agreed that the Dover schools should try to obtain as much federal funding as possible. Kinneer commented, "We should take all we can get."

In other business, the board:

— ADDED to the teaching staff David Johnson and Bradley Rippel, both of New Philadelphia, Mark Stachowicz of Toledo, Patricia Sattler of Mineral City and Sandra Archinal of Broadview Heights.

— ACCEPTED the resignations of Margaret Jones and Elmer Lembright from the teaching staff because of retirement.

— ACCEPTED resignations from extra-curricular activities submitted by Terry Miller, freshman baseball coach; Howard Lorson Sr., extended service for varsity football, and Beryl Scharein, girls track and basketball interscholastic coach.

— APPROVED two weeks extended service for varsity football for David Contini and Tom Daniels.

— GAVE Troup and Pluto Studio of Canton a one-year contract as the official senior class photographer for the 1974-75 school year.

— APPOINTED Donald P. Kennedy to another seven-year term as a member of the Dover Public Library board of trustees beginning July 1.

— AMENDED the vacation policy for fulltime (12-month) employees. For one to 10 years service, employees will receive a two-week vacation, for 11 to 20 years, three weeks, and for 21 or more, four weeks.

— APPROVED attendance at professional meetings for members of the staff and administration.
