School accident

suit dismissed

A \$30,210 damage suit, originally filed against the Dover board of education; Supt. William Kinneer; Robert Schrock, high school principal, and Paul James, an industrial arts instructor, has been dismissed in common pleas court.

Charles Beckley Jr. of RD 3, Dover, filed the action as the result of a June 7, 1972, accident in an industrial arts class. He claimed two of his fingers were crushed and one amputated by a table saw during a class period.

He further alleged that he was operating the saw under James' direction, but that James left the room while the saw, which was not equipped with a safety guard, was being used.

In November, the board of education was dismissed as a defendant by Judge Raymond Rice, who ruled the complaint did not state a claim against the board.
