

Dover board hires teachers for East

Following a report on current enrollment figures, the Dover board of education Monday night approved the hiring of one fulltime and one part-time teachers at East Elementary.

Hired to teach 1st grade, which presently has two classes of 34 students each, was Beth Marburger. Susan Youmans will teach 4th grade on a half-time basis, assisting the two teachers who have classes of 32 students each.

Don Peters, administrative assistant, reported that several students had moved into the East Elementary district since June, accounting for the increased enrollment there.

"The new teachers will get us down to having very desirable classroom sizes throughout the school system," Supt. Bill Kinneer stated.

Both of the new teachers are recent college graduates and were recommended following interviews with elementary administrators.

BOB BAKER of Hanhart Insurance

Agency attended to discuss a possible change in insurance coverage of school property. He said it would be more economical to combine the coverage into a single package, rather than to have it divided up among several agencies as is now done.

The board authorized Clerk Norma Hardwidge to prepare a list of needs and invite all local agencies to submit bids.

IN OTHER business, the board:

— HIRED Deborah Schumacher as a tutor at Dover Avenue, working with learning disability students.

— AGREED to have the Class A sectional basketball tournament at Dover High in February and March.

— ACCEPTED a Strasburg student into the special education program, with Strasburg-Franklin school district to pay transportation costs.

— HIRED a custodial helper and four substitute cafeteria workers, all on a provisional basis until Civil Service examinations are completed.

— NAMED 14 persons to the substitute teaching list.

— HIRED three substitute bus drivers.
