THE TROMBONE KING MARCH Karl L. King

Much of Karl King's life as a musician revolved around the Circus Bands throughout America. Nearly all of Mr. King's marches were classic "Circus Band Marches". These marches, traditionally performed at a faster tempo than military marches, intensified the drama and excitement of the Big Top.

Written in 1945, The Trombone King has remained a favorite of both performers and audiences for nearly forty years.

PIQUE DAME OVERTURE Franz von Suppe (The Queen of Spades Overture)

Franz von Suppe, born in 1819 in the Spalato (what is now Yugoslavia) studied both law and music. In 1840 he obtained a position at the Josefstadt Theatre where he conducted the orchestra, arranged music, and wrote operettas.

In this overture, von Suppe's power of delicate orchestration and his love for the distinct sound of the Military Band are both highly evident. **Pique Dame** has become a mainstay in the repertory of professional, university, and high school bands throughout Europe and the United States.

Sousa was a devoted horseman and a dedicated rider, hence his musical interest in the colorful cavalry units of the United States Army. The pounding rhythms of massed hooves presented him with those six-eight patterns that are so compellingly set forth in this rousing patriotic march.

It is interesting to note that Sousa's unique conducting style of swinging his arm from the elbow rather than the shoulder was the result of an injury he received when thrown from his favorite horse.

THE PINES OF ROME Ottorino Respighi

Born in Bologna, Italy in 1879, young Respighi developed an early and keen interest in music. His pursuit of a career in composition led him to study privately with the great Russian composer Rimsky-Korsakov. Through his studies with the great master, Respighi learned to write in a contemporary Russian style. The symphonic poem, "The Pines of Rome", written in 1924, depicts in sound the ideas and emotions aroused in the composer by the famous pine groves in the vicinity of Rome, and the historical association that they bear.

IV. The Pines of the Appian Way

"Misty dawn on the Appian Way, the great Military highway of ancient Rome - solitary pine trees quard the magic landscape; the muffled ceaseless rhythm of soldiers footsteps can be heard as the consular army approaches. Faint lamenting sighs and the wail of those wounded in battle bring forth an exotic tune. Fanfares are heard echoing down through the centuries. With grand organ, percussion and full brass contributing to the effect, a thunderous ending represents the triumph and might of the Ancient Romans."
