Ashkettle announced his retirement as Ridgewood mentor following the 1980 season after posting a 56-20-4 record in eight years at the helm. Humbert is a former head coach at Indian Valley South and Tusky Valley, Hurst is the grid boss at Strasburg and Marks is an assistant on the Dover High staff.

# A look at the first three games...

The West team will be trying to even the All-Star series at two victories apiece tonight.

Only in the inaugural T-R charity game in 1978 did the West prevail, winning that one 10-8. The East has taken the last two contests, 13-0 in 1979 and 15-14 in 1980.

Those first three games have seen nearly \$25,000 raised for handicapped children and adults as a total of 13,717 fans have viewed the tilts.

**LAST SUMMER**, the East scored a thrilling come-from-behind triumph

when quarterback Mark Addy of Jewett-Scio tallied the decisive touchdown on a one-yard run with two minutes remaining in the game.

The East had taken an early 9-0 advantage on a one-yard TD run by fullback Jeff Swihart of Indian Valley North and a 25-yard field goal by Jewett-Scio's Dana Foster.

Claymont's David Greenwood set up Swihart's touchdown when he intercepted a West pass and returned the ball 39 yards to the one. Monty O'Hara's long 43-yard scamper got the East in position for Foster's field goal.

The West pulled within 9-7 with just 44 seconds left in the second quarter on a five-yard touchdown run by Dover quarterback Jamie DeVore to cap a 71-yard drive in 17 plays. Strasburg's Scott Willis booted the extra point.

DeVore put the West on top with 1:05 remaining in the third period when he ran 10 yards to paydirt. That capped a 54-yard drive and Willis' kick made it 14-9.

The West remained in control until a bad punt snap gave the East possession at the West's 16-yardline with 4:16 left in the game.

O'Hara was the top rusher in the contest with 61 yards in only five carries while River View's Rob Kehl paced the West with 54 yards in 10 tries.

The West piled up a 159-104 advantage in total offense despite coming out on the short end of the score.

Head coaches last year were Claymont's Jeff Gyurko for the East and Garaway's Matt Mottice for the West.

**THE 1979** game was ruled by the East, which held a huge 358-72 margin in total offense.

Only one touchdown was scored — a 46-yard bomb from Central Catholic quarterback Joe Fragasse to Sandy Valley split end Bouncer Murray.

Carrollton placekicker Gary Peterson accounted for the rest of the points as he booted one extra point and field goals of 24 and 22 yards.

Fragasse played only the first half and completed 7 of 11 passes for 109 yards. Claymont's Larry Mills gained 60 yards rushing and also caught three passes for 33 yards and completed two halfback tosses for another 40 yards.

The longest run of the game was a 44-yard dash by Howard Rudolph of Cadiz to set up a Peterson field goal.

Defensively, the East contained the West most of the time as the West never mustered a serious scoring threat.

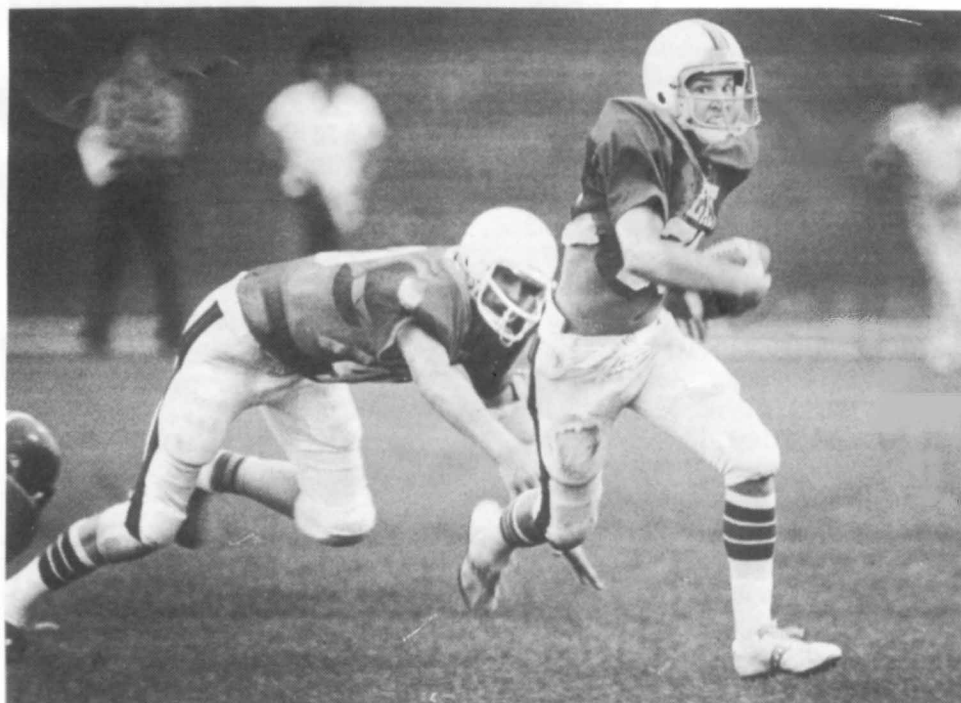
Coaches in that game were Art Teynor of Central Catholic for the East and Ward Holdsworth of Newcomerstown for the West.

**MEANWHILE**, the first East-West clash in 1978 was not decided until only 29 seconds remained.

That's when Tuscarawas Valley's Terry Locker kicked a 28-yard field goal to wipe out an 8-7 East lead.

The West offense was led by Nick Cugliari of Tusky Valley, who rushed for 86 yards in 19 carries and scored his team's lone touchdown. Scott Kettering of Malvern scored the East TD.

Head coaches in 1978 were Dover's Tom Redman for the West and New Philadelphia's Jim Roman for the East.

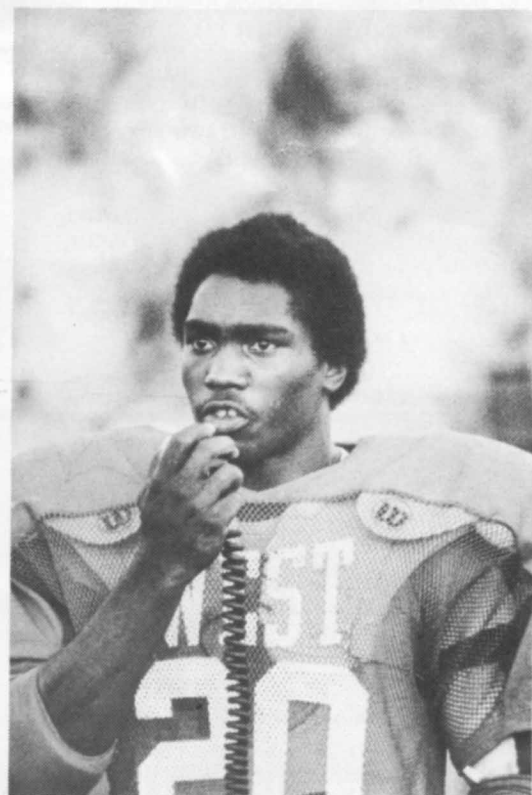

# Officials for tonight's game

Officials for the 1981 East-West Charity All-Star Football Game are Ron Whetstone, Ron Dessecker, Bruce Seabrook, Tom Patton and Terry Straub.

**Whetstone**, a resident of Dover, will be the referee — a position he manned in the inaugural East-West clash in 1978. Ron has been officiating football for 22 years and is secretary/treasurer of the Eastern District Football Officials Assn. He formerly served two years on the Ohio Rules Committee.

He officiates in the Cardinal Conference, Inter-Valley Conference, All-Ohio Conference, Muskingum Valley League and Wayne County League and has worked one state playoff game. Whetstone is employed as supervisor of traffic at Greer Steel Company.

**Dessecker**, the head linesman, has 10 years of football officiating experience and is employed as a machine operator for Westinghouse. He also is a baseball and softball umpire.

An Orrville resident, Ron officiated the 1980 high school football playoffs and works in the All-Ohio Conference, Inter-Valley Conference, Wayne County League, Mid-Ohio Conference and Pioneer Conference.

**Seabrook**, the umpire, has been officiating football for 10 years, working the All-Ohio Conference, Inter-Valley Conference, Muskingum Valley League, Central Ohio League, Pioneer Conference and Tri-County League.

A Dover resident, Bruce is employed

as a lineman by the Ohio Power Company.

**Patton**, the field judge, resides in Strasburg and has officiated football for eight years. He works the Inter-Valley Conference, All-Ohio Conference, Wayne County League and Ohio Valley Athletic Conference.

Tom is employed as the chief pharmacist at Union Hospital.

**Straub**, the back judge, has nine years experience as a football official. He works the Senate League, All-Ohio Conference, Inter-Valley Conference, Wayne County League and Tri-County League.

He resides in Strasburg and is owner Straub's A/G Market in Strasburg.

## Special All-Star rules

1. Each team must use a basic 5-2 defensive front, with no blitzing of the quarterback. Linebacker "stunts" are permitted, and the defense may attempt to block punts and kicks. On goal-line and other short-yardage (3rd or 4th down and 2 or less yards to go) situations, the 5-2 front may be altered.

2. There are *no* restrictions on offensive formations or plays which may be used.

3. The offense will have 30 seconds to get off a play instead of the 25 seconds allowed under federation rules. Each team has the normal 3 timeouts per half, with officials calling "heat" timeouts if necessary.

4. Mandatory numbers for all positions are not in effect, but players with illegal numbers must report to officials. (Example: No. 78 playing tight end or No. 45 on the interior offensive line.)

## MVP awards

Effective this year, one Most Valuable Player will be named on *each* team. In past games, overall offensive and defensive MVPs were selected.

The awards, to be placed in the respective schools' trophy cases, are sponsored by the Exchange Club of Dover.

Previous MVPs (offense listed first) were: 1978, Nick Cugliari (Tusky Valley) and Chris Hensel (Strasburg); 1979, Joe Fragasse (Central Catholic) and Doug Wright (River View); 1980, Jamie DeVore (Dover) and Tim Leppla (West Holmes).

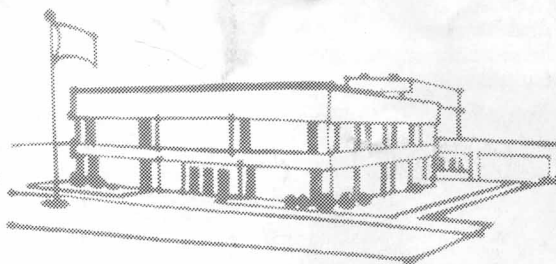
