

North girls romp to Mini-Relays crown

The Indian Valley North girls' track team won the Quaker Ladies Club girls' Mini-Relays Monday at Quaker Stadium as five meet records fell.

The Big Blue totaled 86 points to 70 for host New Philadelphia, 68 for Dover, 46 for Central Catholic, 38 for Claymont and 22 for Cambridge. North won five events to three for New Philadelphia.

North set a new meet record in the shuttle hurdles — 1:09.8 to top its own 1982 record of 1:12.0. The Big Blue also won the shot put, 440-yard relay, 880 relay and sprint medley.

THE QUAKERS set three meet records. They broke the 1982 discus mark of 264-10 set by St. Thomas Aquinas with a total of 276-8. Their two-mile relay time of 10:23.3 broke North's 1983 clocking of 10:29.5.

Also, New Philadelphia's total of 9:54.8 in the distance medley was better than the Quakers' 1982 time of 10:04.3.

Dover broke the meet record in the high jump with a total of 14-2, besting the old mark of 13-10 set last year by New Philadelphia. The Tornados also won the mile relay in 4:28.3.

Central won the long jump with a total of 42-8 $\frac{1}{4}$.

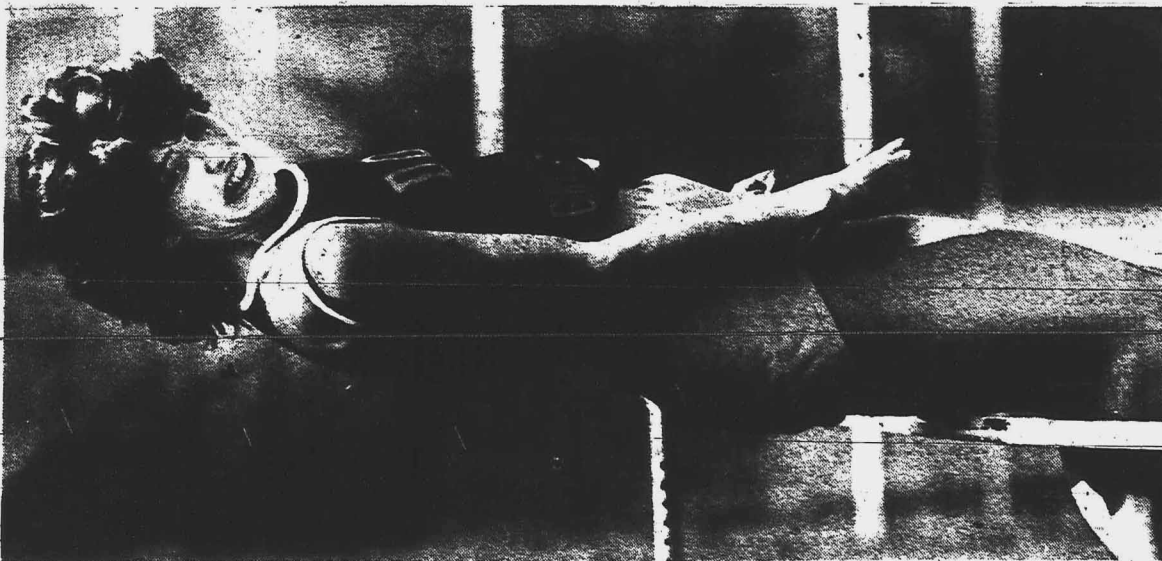
IN OTHER girls' action, Garaway totalled 105 points to take a triangular triumph over Lakeland (32) and Hiland (27). It marked the Pirates' ninth win against one loss.

Susan Mueller and Nancy Sexton each had two individual wins for Garaway. Mueller won the 100 and the 300 hurdles while Sexton won the mile and two-mile. Garaway's Claudia Wilcox won the 100 hurdles and was on the victorious 440 and mile relay teams.

Malvern raised its record to 8-3 by crushing Minerva 90-38. Karen Larke won the high jump, 200 and 400 for Malvern. Katie Larke won the 1,600 and the 800. Kelly Larke won the 300 hurdles and was on three winning relay teams. Debbie Gascon won the 100 and was on two winning relay teams.

IN BOYS' action yesterday, Garaway rolled past Lakeland 96-35. Ron Klein won the low hurdles and the high hurdles, John Hidey won the mile and two-mile while Devon Werker took the 440 and 220 to lead the Pirates.

Minerva won 12 events in sending Malvern to its ninth defeat against two losses by a 108-24 margin. Minerva is 5-3.
