Around the State

SCHUH SETS 3 DISTRICT RECORDS; ORRE RUNS 4:51.9

It seems Ohio's high school girls keep putting their best foot forward as evidenced by another wholesale shuffling to marks at the top of the Ohio Track & Field News' scoreboard.

Junior Donna Schuh of Avon Lake set three district records at Rocky River last week. She equalled the state's fastest time for girls with 11.9 in the 100-meter dash and 24.7 in the 200. Her third mark was 18-71/2 in the long jump, the event she won in the state meet last year in AAA.

Lorain Admiral King won the team crown. Sophomore Melanie Collins led the Admirals, clocking 58.5 to win the 400 and anchoring the winning 400 and 1,600-meter relay teams which set meet record of 49.5

King's Allison Humphries set a discus record with 119-9 and the Lady Admirals posted 1:45.9 in the 800-meter relay for another mark.

Coleen Gallagher, who will enroll at Villanova, sparked Valley Forge to the District title at Case Reserve by winning three events. She won the high jump with a leap of 5-3 on Friday, then took the 1,600 in 5:12.3 and the 800 in 2:21.0. "I've been jumping in dual meets all season, but I didn't start training seriously until a week before the District," Coleen

Gallagher will try to qualify for the state in all three events. "I want to break five minutes in the 1,600. That's what I'm shooting for," she

Kristy Orre of Clayton Northmont missed the alltime Ohio record for 1,600 meters by .6 after she won the event at Dayton in 4:51.9. She also won the 800 in 2:17.0. The alltime Ohio mark of 4:51.3 was set by Connie Jo Robinson of Reading last year.

La Vonna Martin continues to perform brilliantly. The Trotwood Madison star won the 200 in 24.9 and the 400 in 57.4 at Dayton.

Deanna Broz of Brooklyn turned in one of the top AA efforts last week, winning three events at Olmsted Falls. She won the 100 in 12.7, the 200 in 26.0 and the 400 in 58.8.

East Cleveland Shaw's girls became the first in the state this season to break four minutes in the 1,600 relay. The Cardinals stepped to a nifty 3:59.58 at the Cleveland Heights Distirct.

Jamie George, a 14-year-old freshman from Wa ynesville, is having a gree start. Three of here four marks are state-ranked in Class A. They are 5-1 in the high jump, 15-8 in the long jump and 15.9 in the 100-meter low hurdles. She also run the 200 meters in 27.9.

Sunbury Big Walnut has the high-jumping sisters, Jeanna and Kelly Slone. Jeanna has leaped 5-6 and Kelly 5-4 in AA.

Chris Plescia of Circleville improved his AA state-leading discus mark to 177-2 last week. And John Walter of Vandalia, who posted a 54-51/2 shot last week, is only a sophomore. New AAA state leader in the 200 is Jim Gehring of Cincinnati Mt. Healthy with 21.4.

Versatile Ron Hobbs of Columbus Wehrle is still ailing with the mumps, but there's a chance he may recover in time to run on the team's 1600 relay in the regional this week.

Notes from around Ohio

The race for qualifying spots to the state meet in Columbus June 3-4 will come into focus at this weekend's regional meets, and no doubt there will be more surprises in store.

There were several in last week's districts. One occurred in Cincinnati where Princeton, which had shared the 400-meter relay lead with Dayton Meadowdale at 41.9, failed to advance because of a dropped baton that put the Vikings on the sidelines.

Dunbar, billed as the next "superpower in AAA" since it had inherited most of the top stars from Roth High which closed its doors last year, suffered the same fate in the Dayton District. Dunbar had a drop ped baton between the first and second exchanges. So two of the best 400 relay teams are now out, and it's up to Meadowdale to do it.

One of the state's top-ranked high hurdlers, Belford Clark of John Marshall, saw his hopes ended by a very sore hamstring muscle which forced him to scratch from the 110-meter finals at Case Western Resrve University District meet. He had posted a 14.1 clocking.

Clark, who has signed a national letter of intent with Tennessee, purposely false-started in the finals of the 400 because he was hurting, according to his coach, Tom Elkins.

Despite the mishap in the 400 relay, Dunbar qualified 10 individuals in eight events, plus its 1,600 and 3,200 relay teams for this week's Dayton Regional at Welcome Stadium. Two Dunbar high hurdlers, Jeff Earley and Quinthony Brown barely qualified due to injuries.

The Dayton 400 should be a dandy, according to long-time Ohio Track & Field News correspondent Dave Long. "We have six in the field who have broken 49 seconds," said Long, the prep writer for the Dayton Daily News.

Sprinter Rodney Whitlow and Hurdler Pat Walsh of St. Igantius turned in impressive efforts to highlight the CWRU District.

Whitlow, second in the last year's state 100 finals and third in the 200 who is University of Toledo-bound, won the CWRU 100 in 10.6, the 200 in 21.6, ran anchor on the winning 400-meter relay and a leg on the winning 1,600 relay which set a school record 3:22.1

Walsh, who also runs a leg on Ignatius' 1,600 relay and plans to enroll at Miami, O., on a track scholarship, became the first in the state this season to run the 100-meter highs in 14.0 seconds. He did it in the prelims Friday and again in the finals last Saturday.


In the Kent Roosevelt AAA District, sprinter Danny Green proved he's one of the premier dashmen in the state by winning the 100 meters (10.9), 220-yard dash (21.59) and 440-yard dash (48.9).

At the Rocky River District, state cross country champion Bob Mau of River breezed through a distance double. He won the 1,600 meters in 4:22.6 and the 800 in 1:57.0. This week he will run in the Amherst

Cleveland John Adams lowered its state-leading 1,600-meter relay time to 3:17.17 at the Cleveland Heights District.

Hurdler Paul Pallante of Euclid was the standout at the Euclid District where he won the 300 low hurdles in 36.3, the best clocking in the state this season and second-best in the nation. He also has ranking times of 14.3 in the highs and 48.5 in the 400-meter dash.

Pat Dillon moved ahead of brother, Mike, as the two Findlay High stars continued to dominate the AAA discus. Pat took the state lead with a throw of 176-3 at Mansfield. Mike had been the leader with 175-7.
