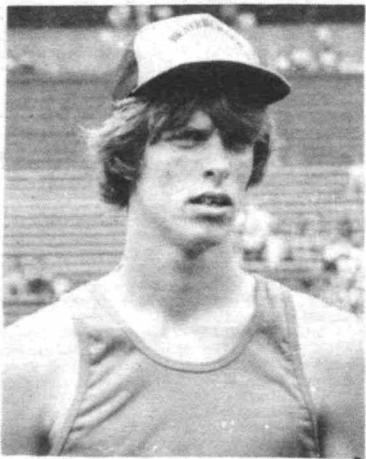

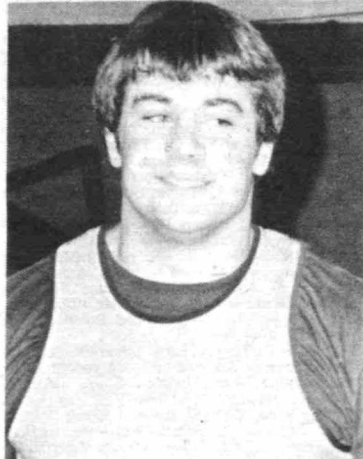

Walker Still Seeking Elusive 70-foot Shot Put

"I know I have a longer throw in me, yet," said Lancaster High's Class AAA state shot put and discus champion Barry Walker.

The 6-foot, 225-pound two-sport star who rushed for 1,119 yards last season and who will play football at Ohio State University in the fall, is still hoping for a 70-foot shot this month as he closes out a brilliant career.

Walker was easily the standout of a small group of Ohioans who competed in post-season meets last month. He went to the Golden West Invitational in Sacramento, Calif., where he took second in the shot with 66-1 $\frac{3}{4}$ and third in the discus at 196-11. Walker then won an exhibition in the 16-pound class with 55-4.

On June 14-15, Walker competed in the Track Athletic Congress junior men's championships in Bloomington, Ind., and won the 16-pound shot with 56-11 $\frac{1}{2}$. He also placed third in the discus with a distance of 160-1.

At the International Prep Meet in Napierville, Ill., Walker took a pair of seconds with 66-10 $\frac{3}{4}$ in the shot and 188-10 in the discus.

"It was a great experience competing in those meets," Walker said. "I have been consistent and I would have liked to have won," he said.

"I haven't been able to get that big throw, but I know I have it in me. Maybe it will come in the next three meets."

Walker will compete in the Lancaster Invitational on July 17, hoping to close out his career on a big note. This is an age group and open meet.

On July 24, Walker will compete with the U.S.A. junior team in a dual meet with Canada, at University of Houston. He will compete in the Junior Pan American Games in Valencia, Venezuela the last week of July and the first week of August. After that he will turn his attention to OSU football, bidding for a starting fullback spot.

"I've been healthy all year and that has been the key to my success," he said.

Can Walker get that elusive 70-foot shot?

"I'm very pleased with what I have done this year. I have been very fortunate. I have had good coaching and good support from my family.

"I think I am one of those athletes who rises to the competition, at least I hope so," Walker said. "The competition in Ohio this year was not as strong. There was no one to push me," he said.

The only other Ohio entry at the Golden West was high jumper Pat Kiesel, the Ohio AAA champion, who placed third with a leap of 6-10. Sprinter Laron Brown of Dayton Roth did not compete.

Brown did compete in the junior nationals at Bloomington, placing 8th in the 400-meter dash in 47.14. Kevin Lyons of Trotwood Madison was third in the 400-intermediate hurdles. His time of 51.67 set an all-time Ohio record. He had 51.91 in the prelims.

Matt Vermillion, Class A state pole vault champion and alltime Ohio recordholder in that event, placed third at Bloomington in 15-9.

Connie Jo Robinson of Reading placed sixth in the Kinney National girls mile championship with 4:48.3. It's the second best ever time for Ohio high school girls, behind Ann Henderson.

Freshman Laura Kirkham of Centerville, now competing for the Kettering Striders, ran her first Heptathlon last week and set an all-time Ohio record with 4,741 points.

Jack Shepard, who keeps tab of the top national prep bests for Track & Field News, told Dayton's Craig Whitmore that Shepard plans to name Kevin Lyons in the 400 IH, Matt Vermillion in the pole vault and Barry Walker in the shot and discus to his All-America prep team.

MICHIGAN DOMINATES SECOND YEAR IN A ROW

Ohio Boys Second, Girls are Third in Fort Wayne Meet of Champions

FOR WAYNE, Ind. — The 9th annual Midwest Meet of Champions belonged to Michigan for the second straight year here on June 12.

Boys from the Wolverine state beat out Ohio for the men's crown, 139 2/3 to 111 $\frac{1}{2}$, and Michigan girls outthrust Indiana, 77-54, in the women's division.

Six meet records were broken in a very competitive meet, two by Michigan, three by Indiana and one by Ohio when the girls' 1600-meter relay sped to a 3:44.96 mark.

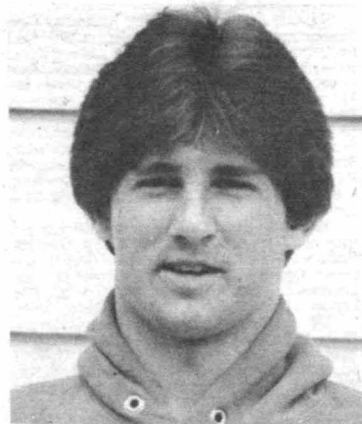
Ohio's other first places went to Dave Bzovi of

Wauesson in the shot put, 58-3 $\frac{3}{4}$, and Kevin Kline of Columbus West in the discus, 176-8.

Ohio scored in every boys event, but was noticeably weak in the 400, 800 and 1,600 relay.

Named the meet's running star was Earl Jones of Michigan, winner of the 1,600 in a meet record of 4:07.20 and Indiana's Lewis Bonds was voted the field event star for winning the high jump at 6-10.

Ohio scored four second places with Glen Shupe in the discus, 176-8; Kevin McKinley in the 110 HH, 13.8; Kevin McBroom in the 100-meter dash with 10.66 and the boys' 3200-meter relay, 7:38.64.



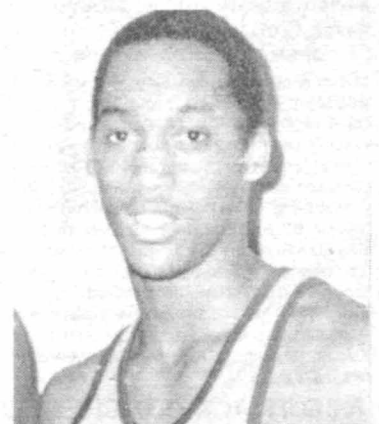

PATRICK'S 20.5 IS FASTEST PREP 200 METERS IN U.S. THIS SEASON

NAPERVILLE, Ill. — Jeff Patrick of Gary Roosevelt turned in the fastest high school 200 meter time this year, 20.5, to highlight the International Prep Invitational at Central College June 19.

Ken Waterhouse of Bloomington, Ind., outkicked J.J. Clark of Maplewood, N.J., to win the mile in 4:10.2. Marc Oleson of Ottawa, Canada, destroyed a quality field in the two-mile, sprinting the final 500 yards for a 8:50.2 win.

In the intermediate hurdles, Detroit's Tom Wilcher escaped disaster when he clipped the final barrier, almost stumbled but righted himself at the finish line to win the 300 event in 37.0.

Cleveland John Adams' Kevin McKinley placed third in that event in 37.9 seconds and Lancaster's Barry Walker was second in the shot put and discus throw with 66-10 $\frac{3}{4}$ and 188-10.

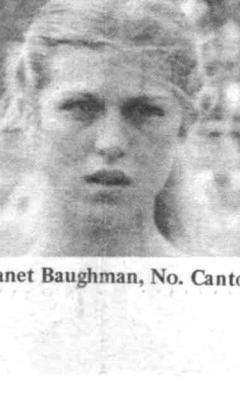

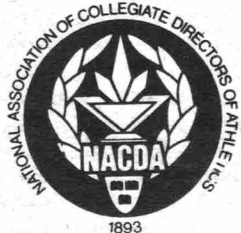
