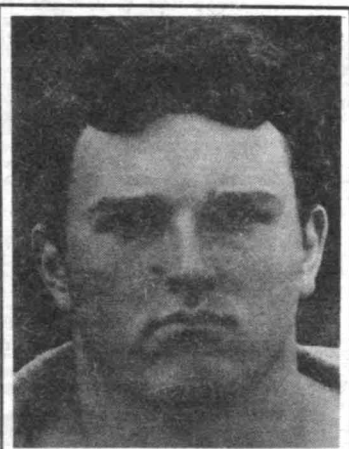

BLOUGH 5th IN KEEBLER INTERNATIONAL TRACK

ELMHURST, Ill. — Gary Blough of Smithville High, Ohio's Class A discus champion, was the only Ohioan to place in the Keebler International Invitational meet here June 18.

Blough placed fifth with a throw of 166-8, far under his season best of 186-2. He won the Ohio title with a throw of 165-3.

Hurdlers Paul Pallante of Euclid and Belfred Clark of Cleveland John Marshall also were invited. Pallante decided at the last minute not to go, and Clark had not fully recovered from a pulled hamstring and felt he should not compete.

MICHIGAN DOMINATES THIRD YEAR IN ROW

Ohio Boys Fourth, Girls are Third in Fort Wayne Meet of Champions

FORT WAYNE, Ind. — "We had a good team, but Michigan, Indiana and Illinois were a little better," said Coach Frank Jancura following the annual Meet of Champions here June 11.

Michigan won the boys and girls' team titles. Boys from the Wolverine state had the depth and scored 155 points. Runnerup Indiana had 134, Illinois 108 and Ohio 60. Michigan's girls beat out Illinois, 57-47, with Ohio third, 36, and Indiana fourth, 33.

Indiana had the most firsts with seven, including all three relays. Michigan won four events, Illinois 3 and Ohio 2. Michigan scored in all 16 events.

Ohio had two victories in the boys' division as Andy Wiese won the 1,600 in 4:14.4 and Reggie Scott took the discus on 178-5. In the girls' section, Theresa Dunn won the 800 in 2:12.6 and Shelly Jorgenson won the high jump with a leap of 5-8.

Ohio's best event was the discus where 16 points

were scored. Buckeye athletes failed to score in the high hurdles, long jump, high jump, pole vault and 1,600 relay.

One veteran observer said, "Ohio was simply outclassed."

The heat affected 11 Ohioans who needed aid. Paul Pallante did not run in his specialty, the low hurdles where he had a 36.3 time this season. And hurdler Robert Pittman pulled up in the highs and Danny Green ran 50 meters and turned an ankle.

The bright spots for the boys were Wiese's victory in the 1,600 and the strong showing in the 3,200 with Andy Herr taking third, Dan Weeman fifth and Pat Farrell sixth.

Rod Woodson of Indiana won the lows in 35.8. That betters the listed national record of 35.76. Woodson also won the 110 highs in 13.7.

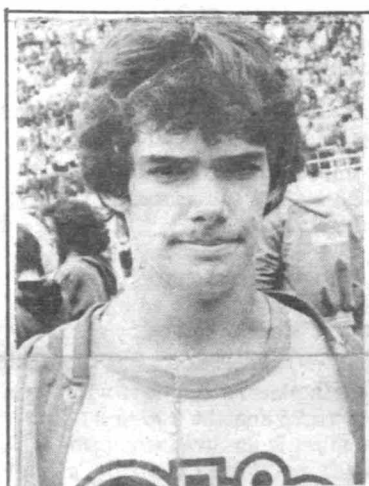

Kellon and Honroth Rule Rebel Octonary

CLEVELAND — A pair of juniors, Jeff Kellon of Cleveland Heights and Candice Honroth of Brecksville captured the 16th annual Rebel Octonary June 11 at Willoughby South.

Kellon, fourth a year ago, came on strong on the second day and finished with a flourish. He scored 7,005 points, finishing 18 points ahead of runnerup Chuck Hamilton of Mentor.

Honroth, strong in the distance events, had the best times in the 800 (2:23.8) and 1600

(5:37.5) on the final day and won the girls' crown with 6,875 points. Second was Betty Brooks of Collinwood.

"I felt confident with my two strong events," said Honroth, a 5-8, 17-year-old. "What helped me is that I did well in the hurdles and sprints and my weak events, the field events."

Kellon had the best high jump (6-4) and long jump (21-7).

"Winning here is one of the few good things I did this year," Kellon said.

LaVonna Martin, Kirkham get 2nd in U.S. Jr. meet

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. — Ohioans acquitted themselves well at the United States Junior Men's and Women's track championships at Penn State's Nittany Lion Track, June 24-26.

The meet is sponsored by The Athletic Congress, America's track and field governing body, and it attracted many of the top under-20 year old male and under-19 female athletes.

LaVonna Martin of Trotwood Madison and Laura Kirkham of Centerville, both competing for Northwest Track Club, sparked the brightest among the Ohio contingent. They both took second places.

Martin, who won three events to lead Trotwood to the Ohio AAA girls' state title last month in Columbus, was runnerup in the 400 hurdles with a time of 60.31.

Kirkham, who won the Ohio long jump crown by spanning 19-7 1/2, finished third at the U.S. junior meet with a leap of 18-10. Kirkham also came in second in the Heptathlon, scoring 5,148 points for the seven-event program.

Her point total broke the national record for a tenth grader. By finishing second she qualified for the women's National Junior team and will represent the United States in

STATE MEET RECAP:

Individuals Sparkle as 17 Records Tumble

COLUMBUS — Outstanding individual efforts by juniors LaVonna Martin and Susan Nash and by seniors John Austin and Tom Shetler triggered 17 records at the 76th annual state track and field meet June 3-4. Four of the marks were by boys and 13 by the girls.

Martin and Nash were the stars of stars after leading their teams to team titles, the first for Trotwood Madison and second in three years for Zanesville Rosecrans.

Martin became the first athlete in the nine-year history of the girls' meet to score all her team's points, 30, by winning the 100 in 12.05, the 200 in 24.91 and the low hurdles in a meet record 13.82 giving Trotwood the team crown. She also qualified for the 400 finals but flase-started.

"I was talking to myself at the starting line," Martin said. "I kept saying 'Get out, get out.' I think I was concentrating too much."

Nash was equally brilliant in leading Rosecrans to the Class A title, 54-45, over defending champion Minster. Nash won the 100 in 12.74, the 400 in 57.35 and the 800 in a meet record 2:12.76. She also anchored the winning 1,600-meter relay.

Columbus East repeated as AA girls' champion, edging Cadiz, 30-28. Hurdler Mary Hawkins and sprinter Karen Wingo paced East.

The 1983 boys' champions were Columbus Wehrle in A, Dayton Jefferson in AA and Marion Harding in AAA as predicted by Ohio T&F.

Leading Wehrle were sophomore hurdler Lewis Nowlin, who won the highs in 14.94 and placed second in the lows, and Steve White who was third in the 200.

Jefferson, which edged Bedford Chancel, 64-56, had three firsts — Gus Hutchins in the highs (14.33), Darren Cordell in the 800 (1:54.93) and its 400 relay winning, 43.09. Chancel made a strong run with Cecil Washington winning the 400, Kevin Henderson the low hurdles (37.07) and victories in the 3,200 and 1,600 relays.

Marion Harding celebrated its first state title thanks to the individual efforts of Robert Pittman and Zorba Ross and its 1600 relay. Pittman won the high hurdles in 14.36 and was third in the lows with 37.13. Ross won the long jump with a leap of 23-1 1/4 and took second in the 400, 48.39. Marion's 1600 relay placed third.

Rocky River distance ace Bob Mau, who was bidding for a distance-double in the 800 and 1600 runs, had to drop out due to an aggravated heel injury which developed at the Amherst Steele Regional.

Austin led Delaware Olentangy to fourth place in AA boys with his sprint victories, taking the 100 meters in 10.75 and the 200 in 21.96.

Shetler, defending 1600 Class A champion from Strasburg, came in second this time, but won the 3,200-meter run in 9:32.8. Shetler's time in the 1600 was 4:19.9, and the winner, Mark Pierson of Lynchburg Clay, posted 4:18.1.

Cincinnati entries earned a lot of respect by winning six events, three by boys and three by girls. The boys' winners were Leroy Williams of Greenhills in the AAA 400, Moeller in the AAA 400 relay and Princeton in the AAA 1600 relay. Girls' winners: Forest Park in AAA 800 relay, Cincinnati Academy of Physical Education in the 400 relay and Dawn DeHart of Loveland winning the discus throw for the second year in a row with a record 145-2 in AA.

Jeff Doughty of Ravenna Southeast retained his AA pole vault title with a bit of luck. Doughty just managed to take the fourth and final qualifying spot in the Brooklyn Regional. At Columbus he cleared 13-8 to win the event. As a junior last year he won with 14-6.

Susan Nash of Zanesville Rosecrans became the first girl since '75 to win four gold medals at the state meet. She had firsts in the 100, 400 and 800 and she ran on the winning 1600 relay.

Patty Metzler of North Jackson Milton has signed a letter of intent to attend North Carolina University. She won four straight state 'A' 1600 meter championships and three state cross country titles. Berea's Andy Herr, who won the state 3,200 title, also will attend N.C. State.

Next year's Second Annual Jesse Owens Classic will not have any high school teams. The OHSAA plans to enforce the rule which would not allow high schools to compete in the same meet with open or college athletes. This also affects a number top cross country meets.

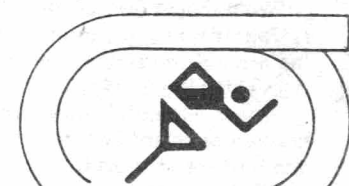

OHIO GIRLS RANK SECOND IN MIDWEST COMPARISON, BOYS ARE EIGHTH BEST

Ohio's girls out-sparked their male counterparts by placing second in the 20-state meet comparison compiled annual by Don Lindstrom of the State Journal in Madison, Wisconsin.

According to Lindstrom's compilation, Illinois was first in the girls with 98 points, followed by Ohio with 56 and Michigan third with 44. Next came Indiana, 41, Kansas with 39 and Tennessee with 36. It marked the ninth straight year the Illini girls have led the Midwest.

Boys from Illinois came in first for the eighth time in the last 12 years, compiling 105 points. A distant second was Michigan with 65, followed by Indiana with

58, Missouri 51, Wisconsin 43, Oklahoma 36, Kansas 34, Ohio 32, Colorado 27 and Tennessee rounding out the top ten with 24 points.

LaVonna Martin of Trotwood Madison, who led her team to the state AAA team title by winning the 100, 200 and 100-meter low hurdles, was the Midwest leader in the low at 12.82.

This was the 13th year of Lindstrom's Midwest comparison of state-meet results and 20 writers participated. The two Ohio representatives are Tim May of the Columbus Dispatch and Ed Chay of The Plain Dealer and publisher of Ohio Track & Field News.
