

Dover, Phila score well at Ashland meet

Dover captured three first places and New Philadelphia notched one during the 12-team Ashland Relays indoor track meet at Ashland College Saturday.

Although no team scoring was recorded, coaches Jim Heller of Dover and Denny Edwards of New Philadelphia were pleased with the early showing. Other participating schools were Ashland, Galion, Lancaster, Mansfield Madison, Mansfield Malabar, Oberlin, Shelby, Toledo Whitmer, Wadsworth and Wooster.

Dover got its firsts from Dan VanEpps in the triple jump, Greg Arbogast in the 300 meters and Bryan Miller, Chris Mills, Arbogast and Dave Polce in the 12-lap relay.

The Tornados were second in the 8-lap relay (Arbogast, Mills, Chris Wagner, Miller) and the 24-lap relay (Leroy Phillips, Scott Lupi, Chris Sweitzer, Devin Stauffer). Todd Altier was second in the shot put, Ken Smith was second in the 3200 meters and Polce was second in the 400. Miller set a school record of 6-feet-4 as runnerup in the high jump.

Arbogast was fourth in the 50-meter dash, VanEpps was fifth in the long jump, Dan Hurst was fifth in the triple jump, Wagner was sixth in the 50-meter high hurdles and Bill Lieser was sixth in the 2-mile.

New Philadelphia's Doug Gibbs won the hurdles, Blake Bailey was third in the 50-meter dash, Brian Hadley was third in the high jump, Al Ledrich was fourth in the shot put and Dave Glass was sixth in the 1600 meters.
