72 area athletes await state track meet

Becki Schoelles will need a personal secretary to keep up with her appointments in this weekend's state track and field meet at Ohio State University.

For the second straight year, Indian Valley North's superb sprinter has qualified for state competition in four events. However, such success can have its drawbacks at this meet.

SCHOELLES IS scheduled to run in the preliminaries of those four events Friday over an hour and 40-minute span - the first three coming within 40 minutes of each

If the senior doesn't scratch herself from any of the races, her afternoon at Ohio Stadium will look like this:

At 2:50, run the 100-meter dash; at 3:10, anchor North's 800 relay squad; at 3:30, anchor the Big Blue's 400 relay team; and at 4:30 — if she's still standing — run the 200

She is joined in both relays by Jessie Metzger, Terry Benadum and Carmen Searcy. They were regional champions in both events (51.6 seconds in the 400 and 1:48.4 in the 800).

Schoelles may have the worst schedule of the 72 state meet entrants from The Times-Reporter area, but she certainly is not the only multiple-event qualifier. Of those 72 athletes, 19 are entered in more than one event.

TUSKY VALLEY boasts the only three triple qualifiers in seniors Sandy Moore, John Sponaugle and Toby Oswald.

Distance heavyweights Moore and Sponaugle are going in the same three events Saturday. They will compete in the 1,600 and 3,200 runs and the 3,200 relay opposite divisions, of course.

Oswald will compete in the pole vault on Friday and the 800 run Saturday, besides joining Sponaugle in the 3,200 relay.

Sandy Valley's Jeff McCaulley and Oswald are a sound bets in the Class AA pole vault. They placed 1-2 at the regional, McCaulley going 13-feet-113/4 and Oswald

In the Class A pole vault on Friday, the Newcomerstown duo of Dave Bell and Dan Roan are expected to fare well (see related

IN THE 'AA' girls' weights, the trio of Beth Manson of Sandy Valley, Lisa Cline of West Holmes and Beth Wesney of River View advanced in both Friday's shot put and Saturday's discus.

Manson is the standout of the group, throwing the shot 40-8 and the discus 128-11.

Claymont's Andy Pentecost and Tusky Valley's Mark Mansill will continue their personal duel in the 'AA' discus on Friday. Pentecost's season best is 166-0 and Mansill's is 157-0.

Other leading contenders to place high in Columbus include Dover's 400 relay quartet of Greg Arbogast, Dan Hurst, Jeff Margletta and Chris Mills. They were regional champions with a time of 43.8.



Nc'town vaulters began in backyard

NEWCOMERSTOWN - In a sport where individual competition can be demandingly cruel, two friends spur each other to new heights, literally.

Dave Bell and Dan Roan are senior pole vaulters on the Newcomerstown High track team. Friday at 3 p.m., both will pit their skills in the 77th annual state meet at Ohio Stadium in Columbus. Bell will also throw the discus at the state meet Saturday at 9 a.m.

IT'S A LONG way from Bell's backyard to the horseshoeshaped stadium at OSU.

Bell's backyard was where it all began for the duo in the 6th grade.

"Me and 'Buzz,'" Roan begins, referring to Bell by his nickname, "rounded up an old pole vault pit from the school and put it in his backyard. But before that we did it without a mat. We would cut down small trees and use them.

"I had a lot of splinters in my arms when those sticks broke. Bell said with a laugh.

The pair were next-door neighbors in those days and the interest in track came from Newcomerstown's outstanding tradition.

"We worked track meets a lot when we were young," Roan said. "The older neighborhood kids started it, and we picked it up from there.

Bell credits Tom Addy, a 14-foot-6 vaulter in college, as a

"He helps us out a lot and gives us a lot of his time," Bell said.

Bell owns the top mark of the two- a school record of 14 feet set last month at the River View Invitational. He has cleared 14-2 in practice.

AT LAST week's Class A regional in New Concord, Bell eclipsed his own meet record of 13-0 as he soared $13-7\frac{1}{2}$. He missed three tries at 14-31/2.

The fact that Bell was even at the Muskingum College field was impressive. While wrestling this past winter, he broke his collarbone and missed the first two weeks of track season. Sometimes he can feel the strain of it "pulling" when he streaks down the runway on his





approach to the vaulting pit.

"I missed five meets this year," he said. "When I came back from the collarbone, I think I was pushing myself too hard. That's why I tore a muscle in my leg.

Bell also endured torn cartilage in his knee last summer and injuries at the conclusion of the last three seasons of wrestling.

At last year's state track meet, Bell placed fourth with a vault of 12-6. All six placers at the meet cleared 12-6, but the order was determined by

number of misses. THIS YEAR, Bell is after the top spot - alone.

"I want to win the state," he said matter-of-factly. "My goal at state is to go 14 feet. I think I can go a lot higher than I have been. I know I've been over lower heights by a lot. I usually just don't do as well once there is no competition."

Newcomerstown's veteran coach, Ernie Art, noted that Bell has suffered each time he has gone for a new height by

Roan also is familiar with injury. He broke his arm while pole vaulting in Bell's backyard during his 8th grade track season.

"It was kind of funny," Roan said. "A girl on the track team was practicing hurdling over lawn chairs in her yard and broke her arm the day after I

ROAN OWNS a season-best of 13-6 and finished third at the regional with a vault of 12-10.

"Last year I was fifth in the regional and really disap-pointed that I didn't make it to state (only the top four qualifying)," Roan said.

This weekend, both Roan and Bell hope to make up for any disappointment suffered in the


