Intrigue, comedy combined in summer theatre's finale

The mystery-comedy, to be presented "in the round," features Chuck Garber as Daniel Corban, the newly-wed husband whose wife disappears on their honeymoon.

Floyd A. May, founder of the summer theatre, will play Inspector Levine, the man Corban employs to find his missing wife, portrayed by Donna Mastin.

Other characters that add to the suspense and intrigue of the play are: Robert Schrock as Everett Parker, Corban's boss; Mrs. Donna Mitchell as Parker's secretary, and Joe Webb as Sidney, the sandwich king and only witness to Elizabeth Corban's identity.

Garber, a member of the Strasburg Dramatic Club, is no stranger to Dover theatre. He appeared in "The Petrified Forest" and is best known for his portrayal of Oscar in "The Odd Couple."

May, who played Felix opposite Garber in "The Odd Couple," has been speech teacher and dramatic director at Dover High 14 years.

Miss Mastin, was a four-year member of Thespians at Dover High where she played major roles in "All My Sons," "Butterflies Are Free" and "The Sound of Music." She also appeared in the summer theatre production of "Music Man." A sophomore at Miami University, she is majoring in psychology.
