


Balmy Skies Give A Show-Biz Finish to Graduation

The highlight of the year had to be the rousing come-from-behind 30-24 win over rival Morgan to tie the national Dual Meet record of 37!



Struggling early in the season, the reserve fledgling Tornadoes finished on a strong note posting a record of 7-8 overall.












