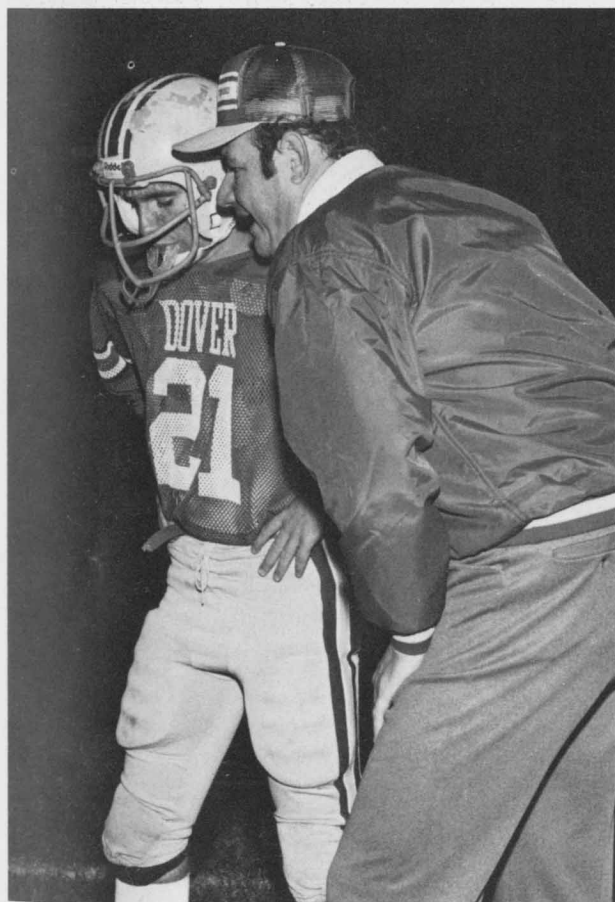
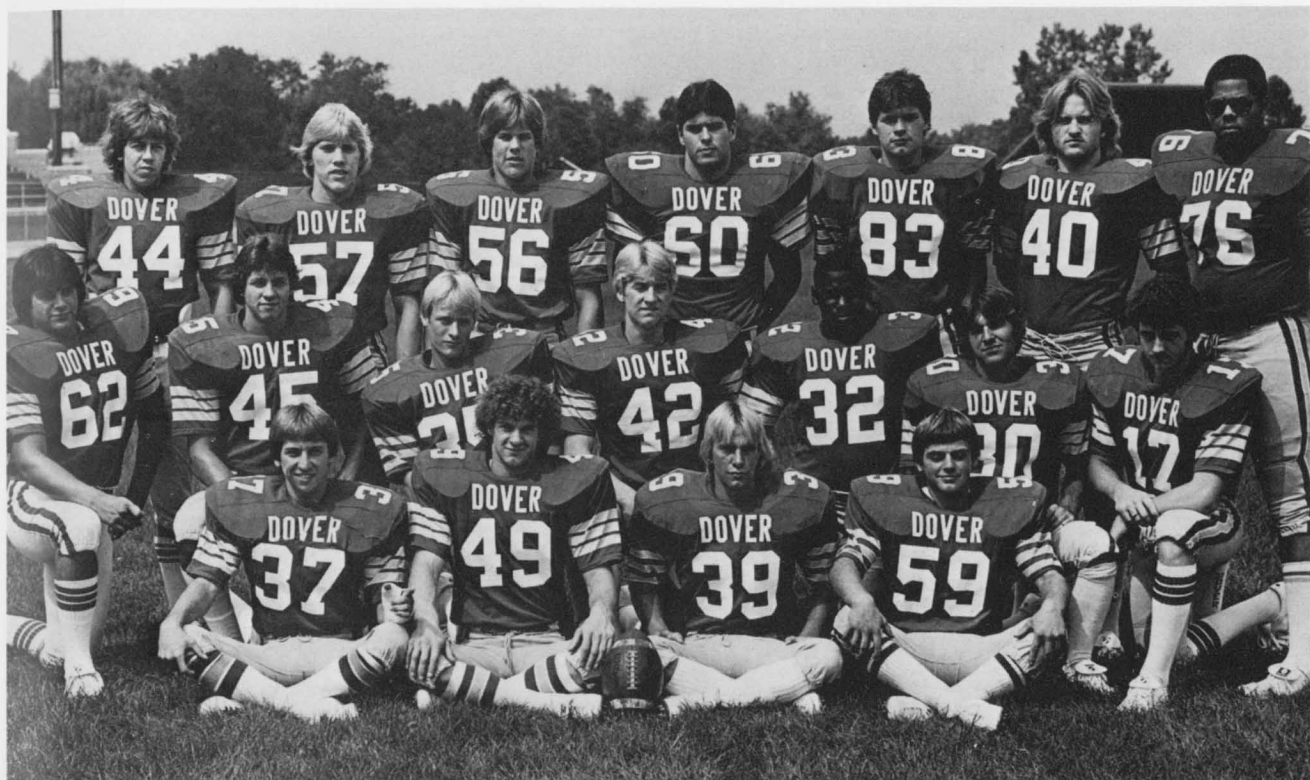


# Bob's Big Boys ... OH SO TOUGH!

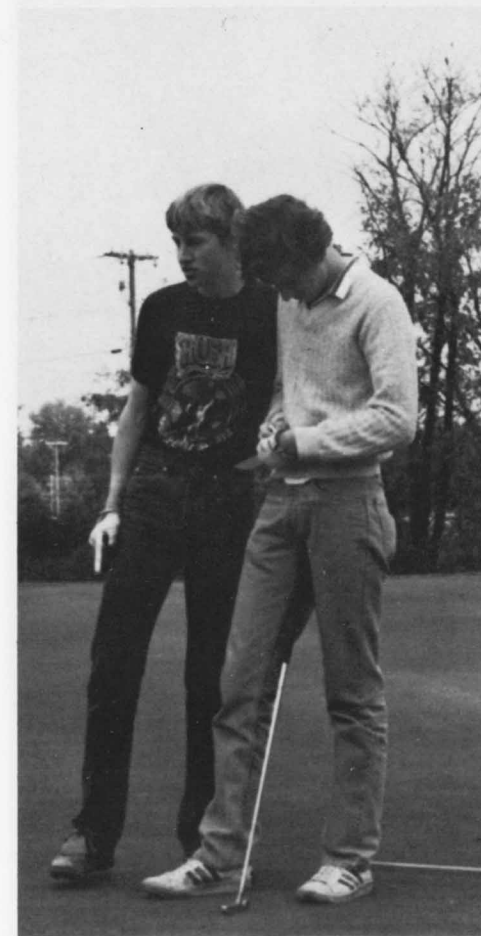
# the Greatest Seasons Ever

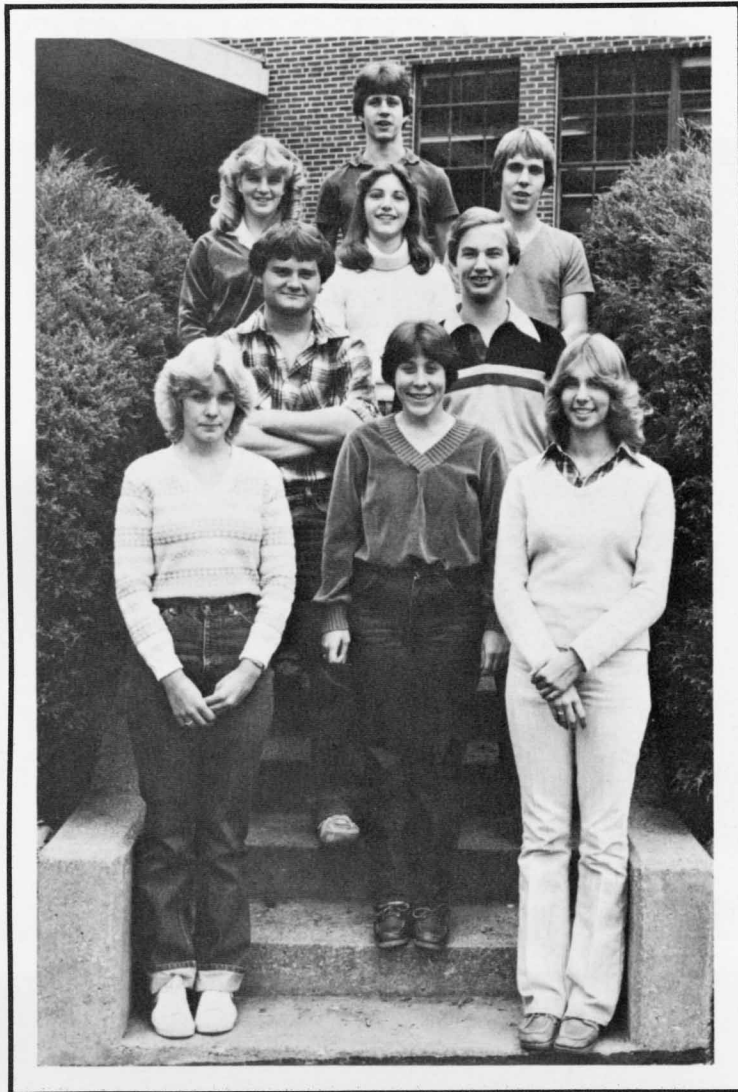

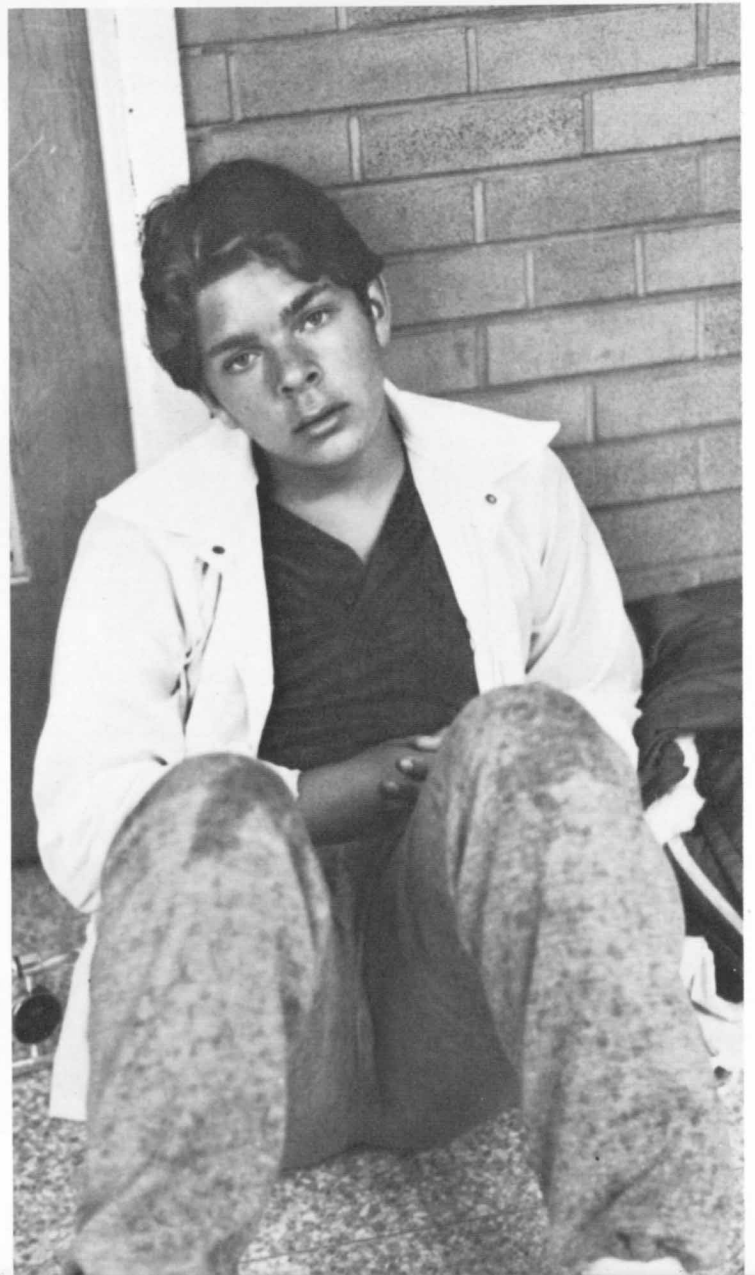
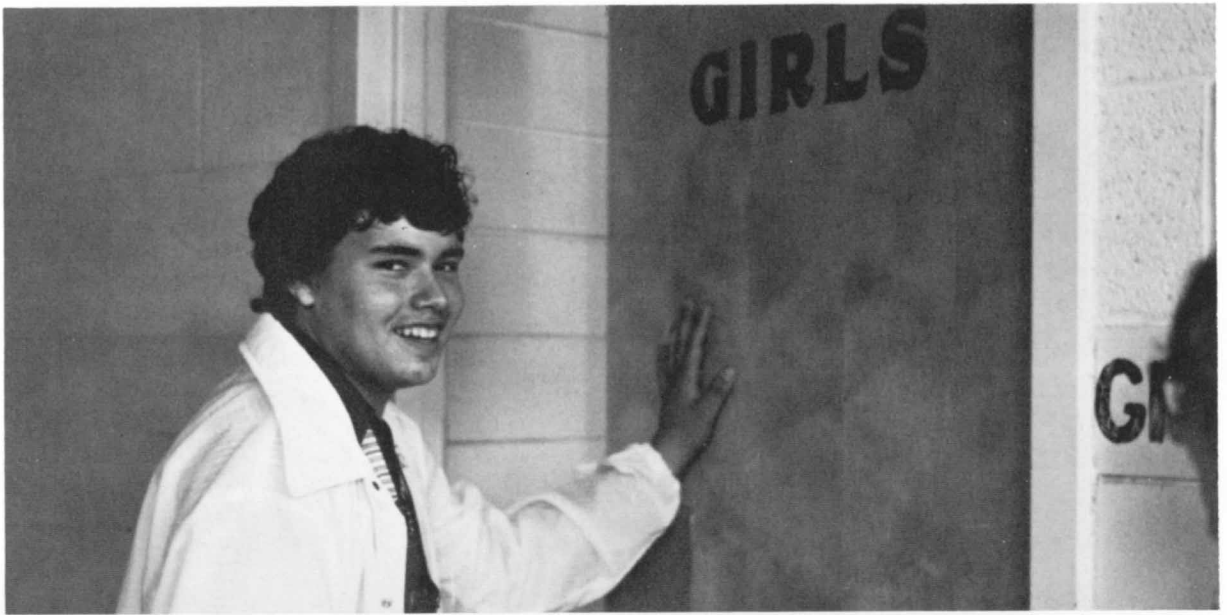


# YEAR FOR DOVER BAND

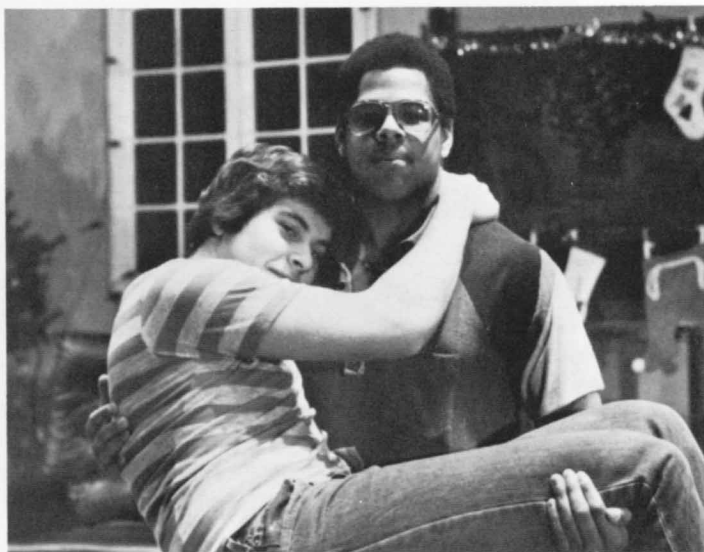

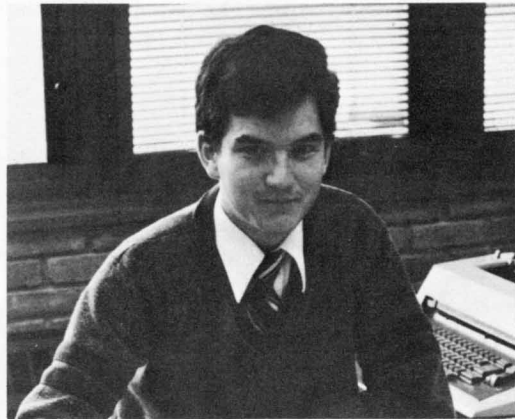
