

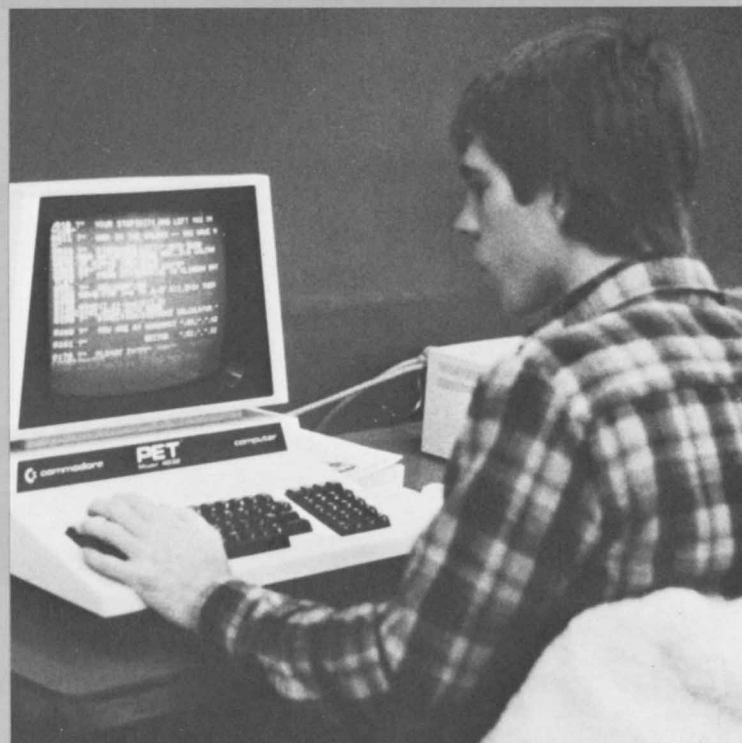

Three cheers for D.H.S. students who really got into the sights, sounds and SPIRIT of the old Crimson and Gray tradition, while adding a few new attractions along the way!



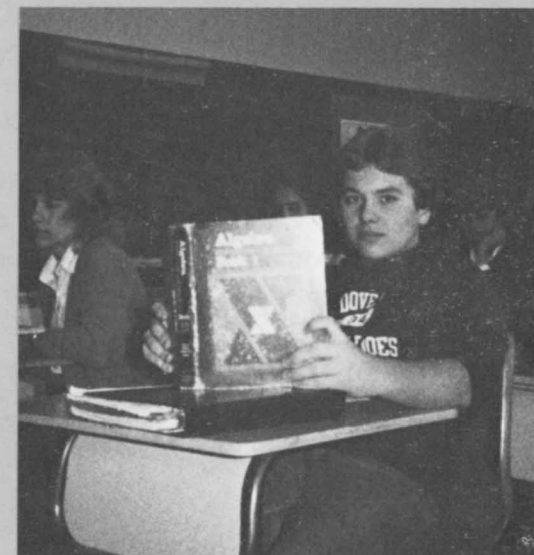
