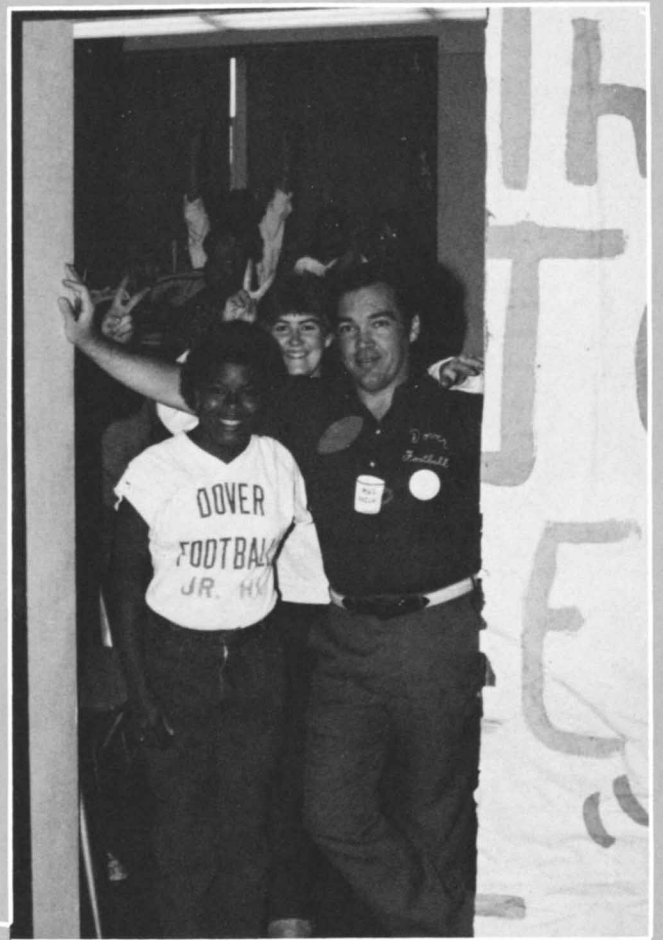

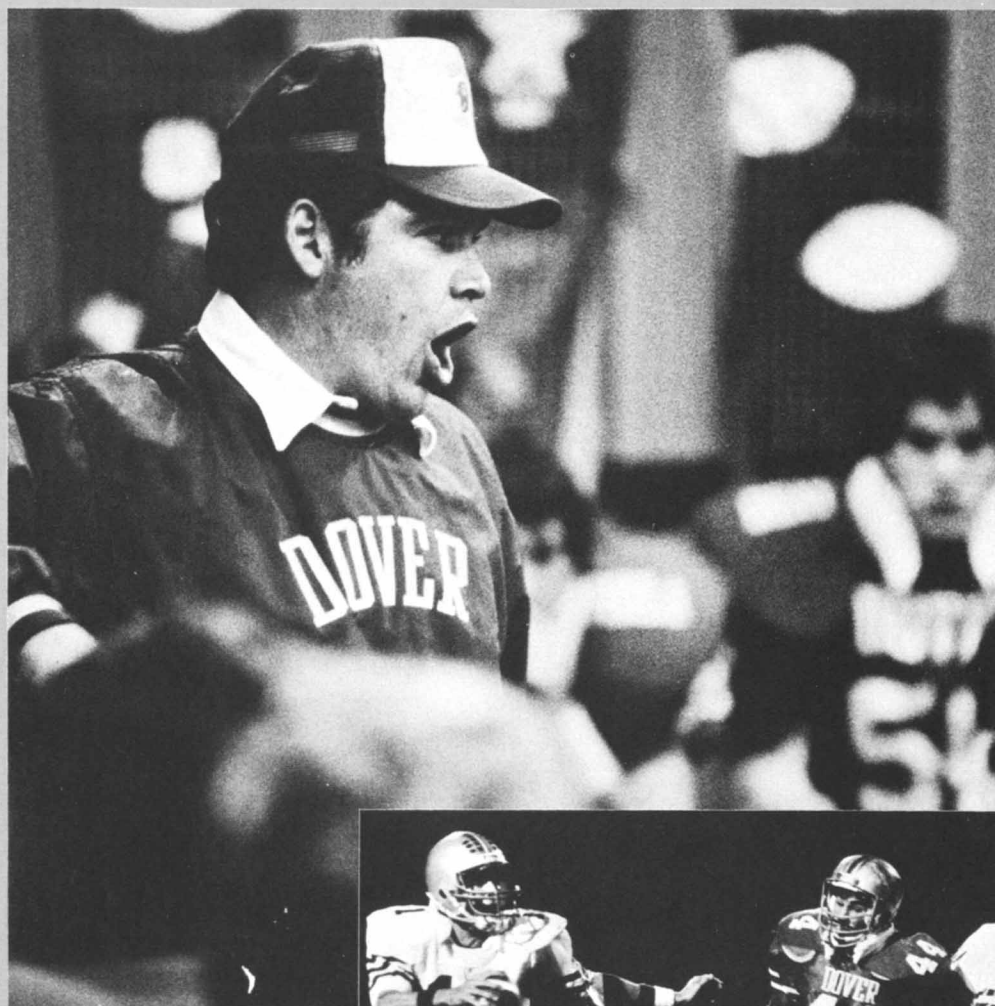

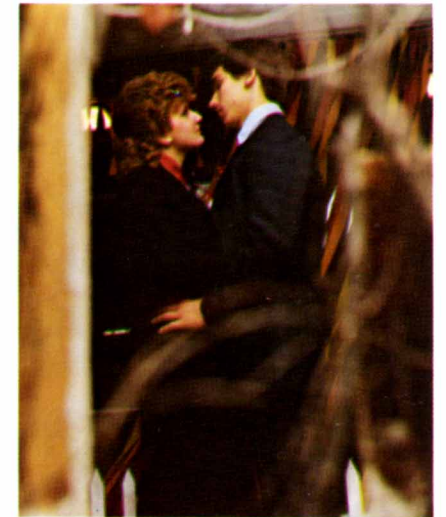

PUTTING IN EXTRA TIME AT D.H.S.

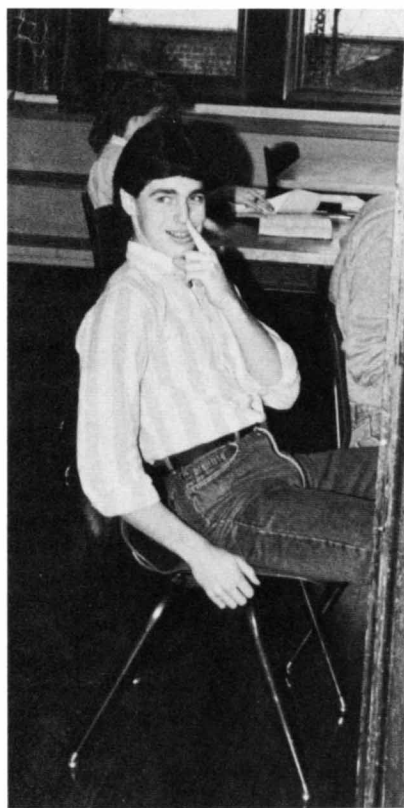

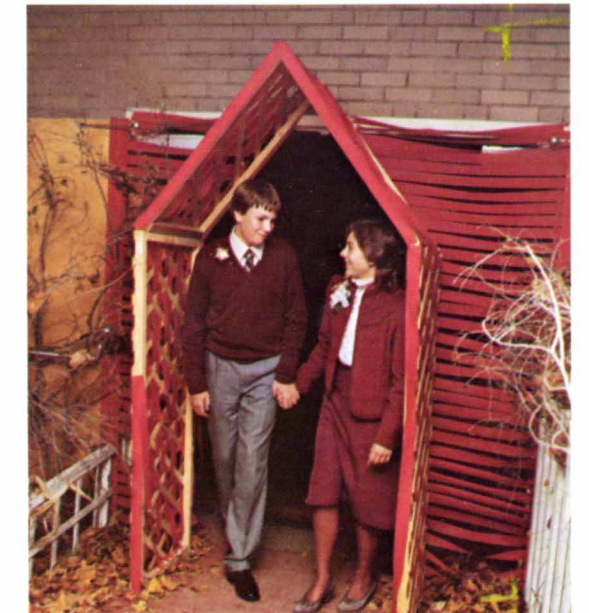

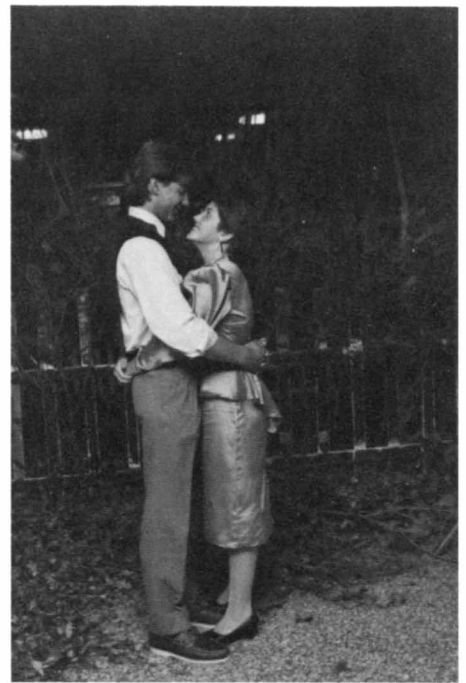
For the most part, The Homecoming was an enjoyable evening, which only goes to show that it really was "The Time of the Season."

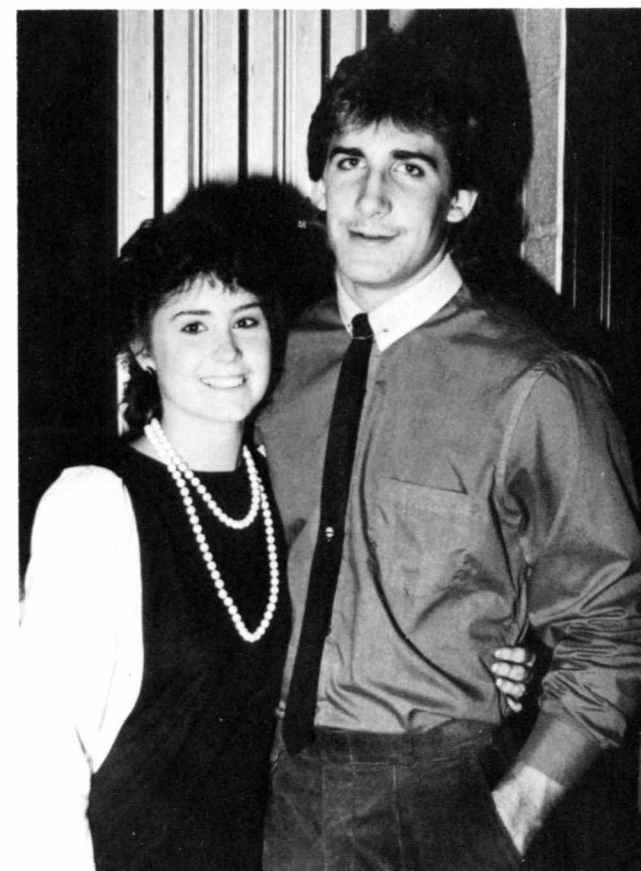

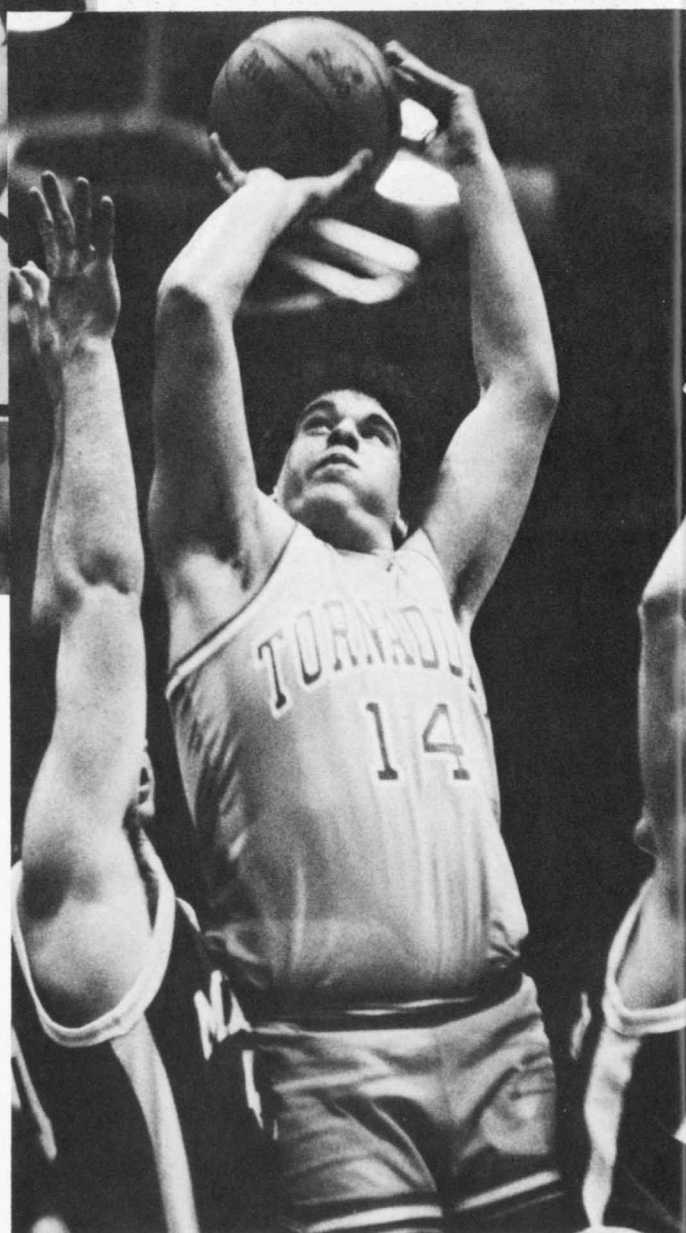
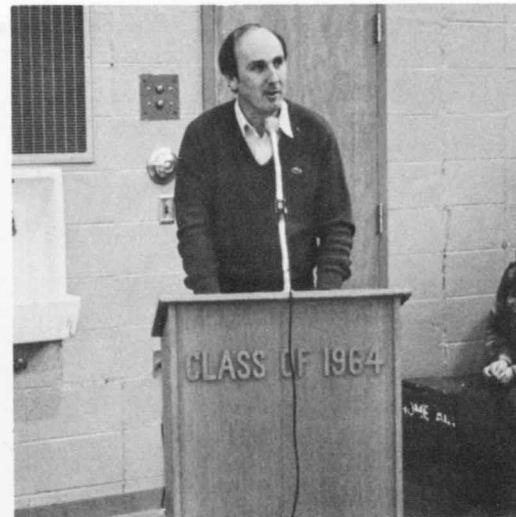
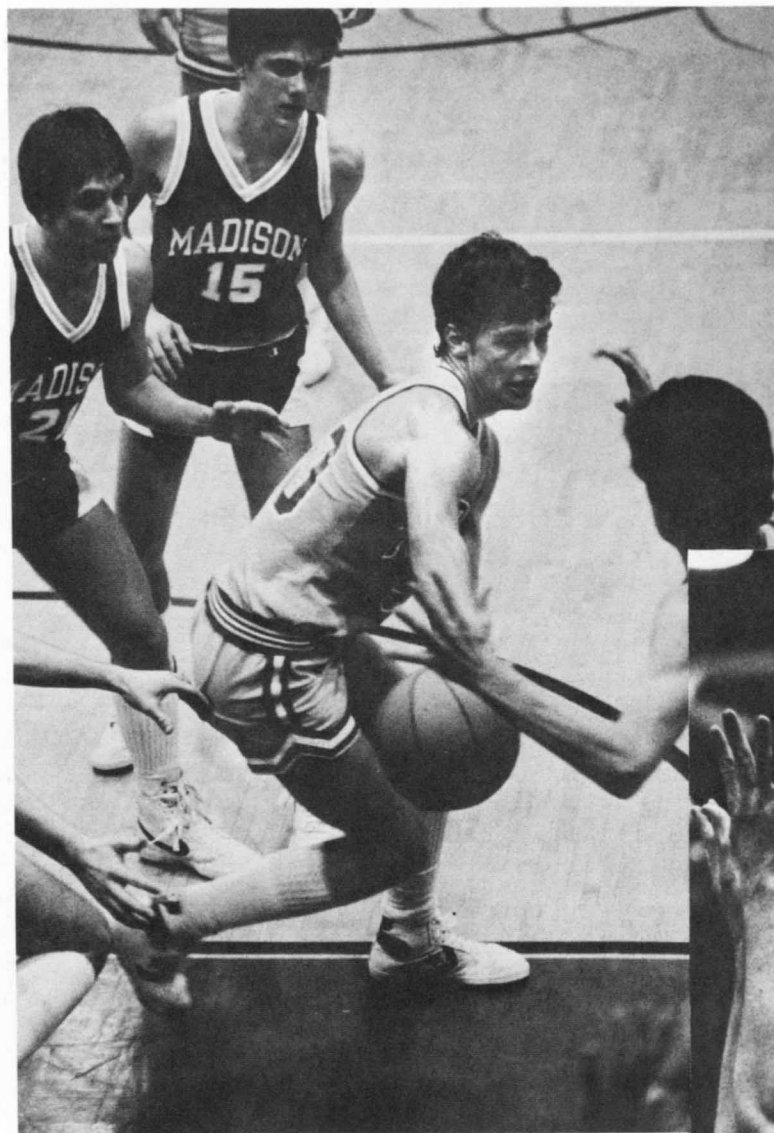
Dover Basketball on the Upswing

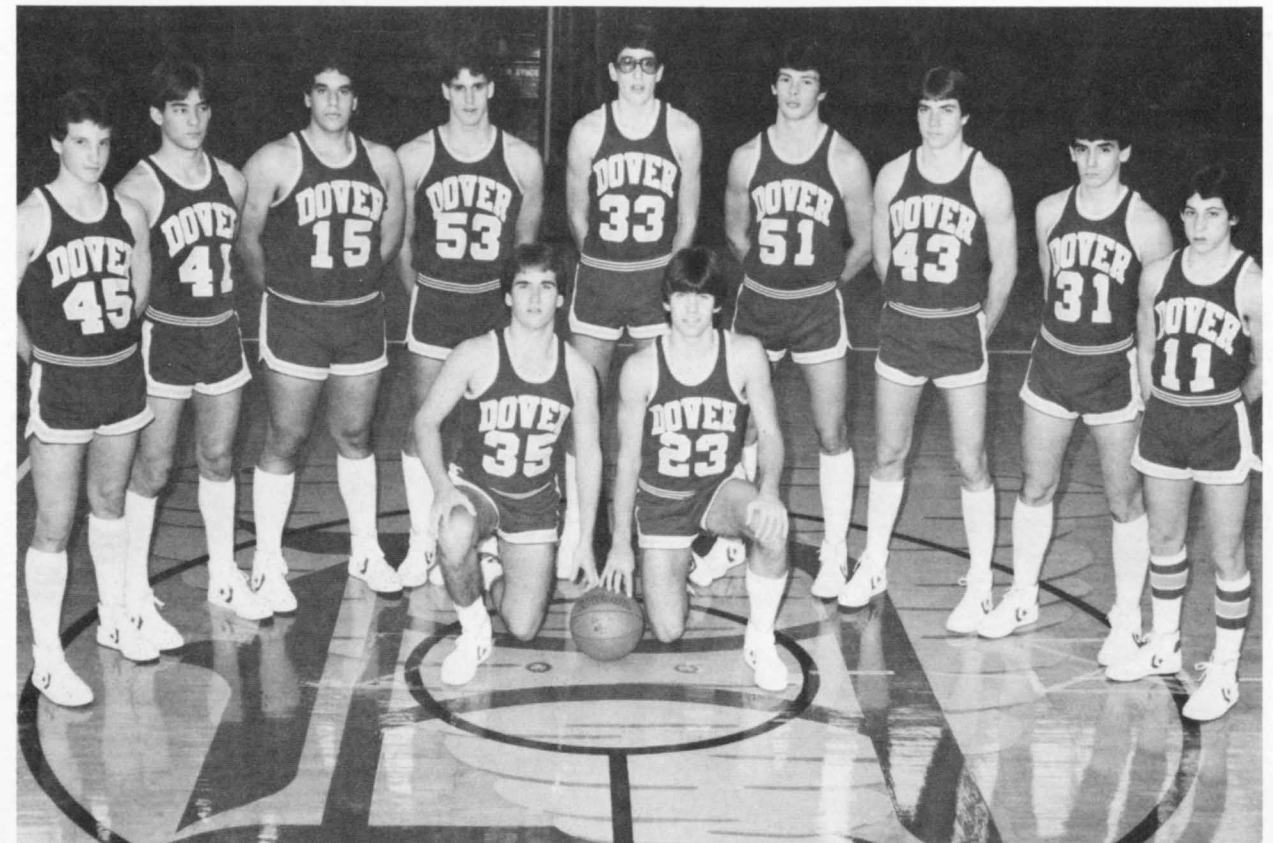

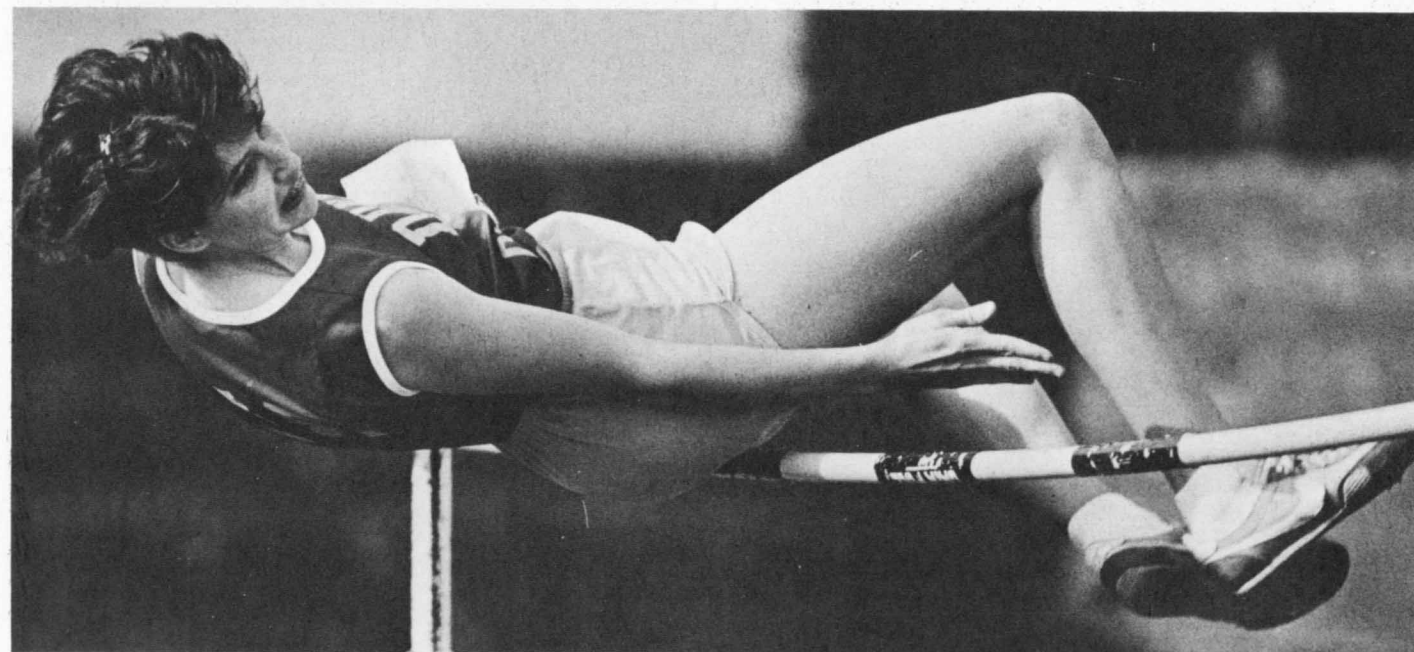
The 1984 edition of the girl's track team was the turning point in the program. We finished the year with 42 girls, 40 of whom will return next year.

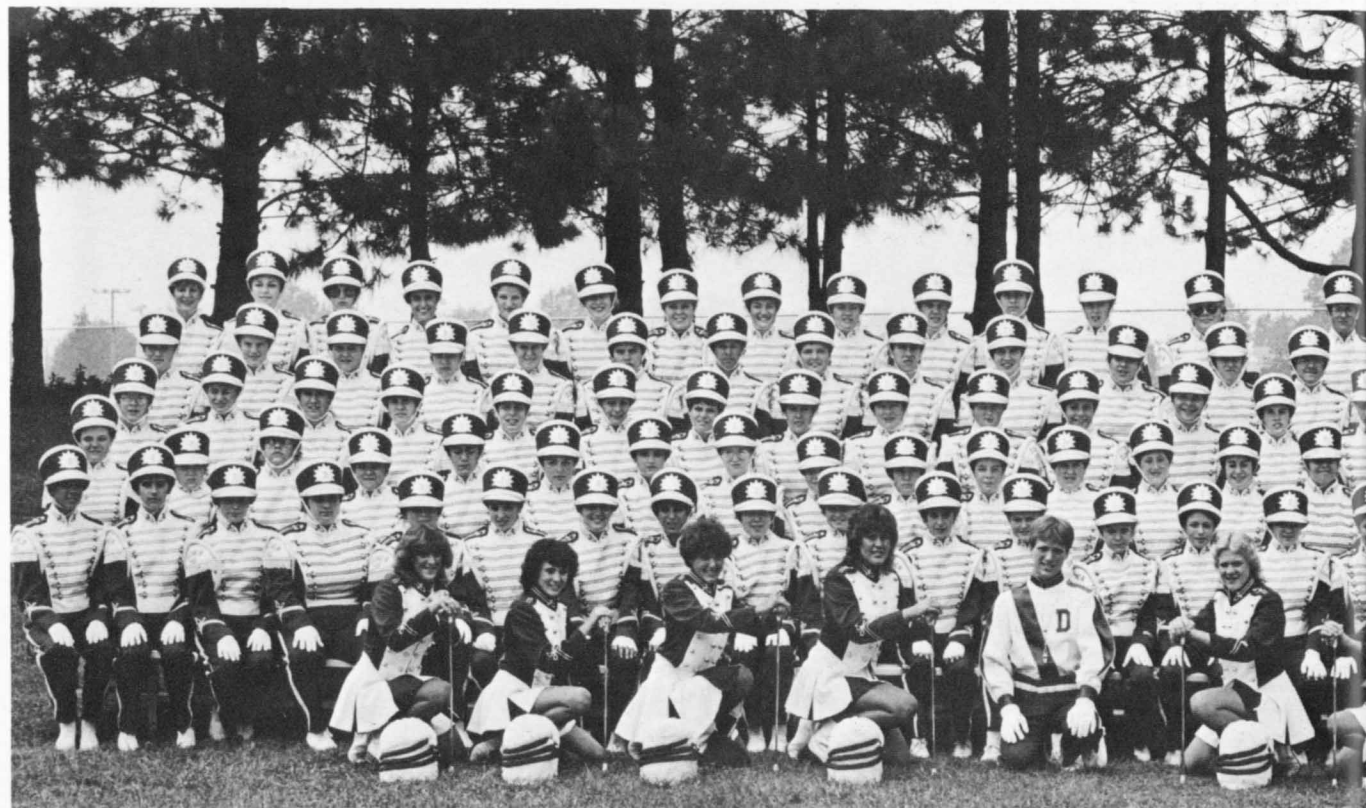

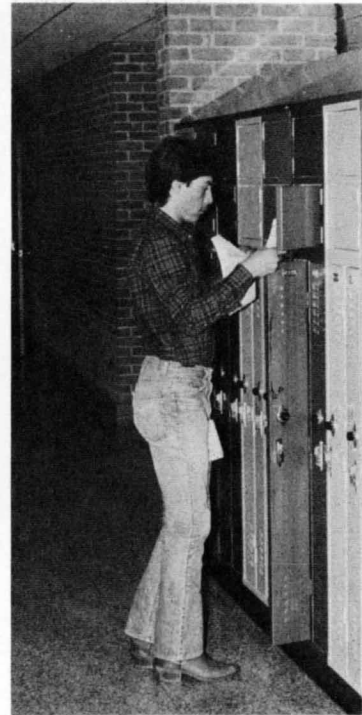
