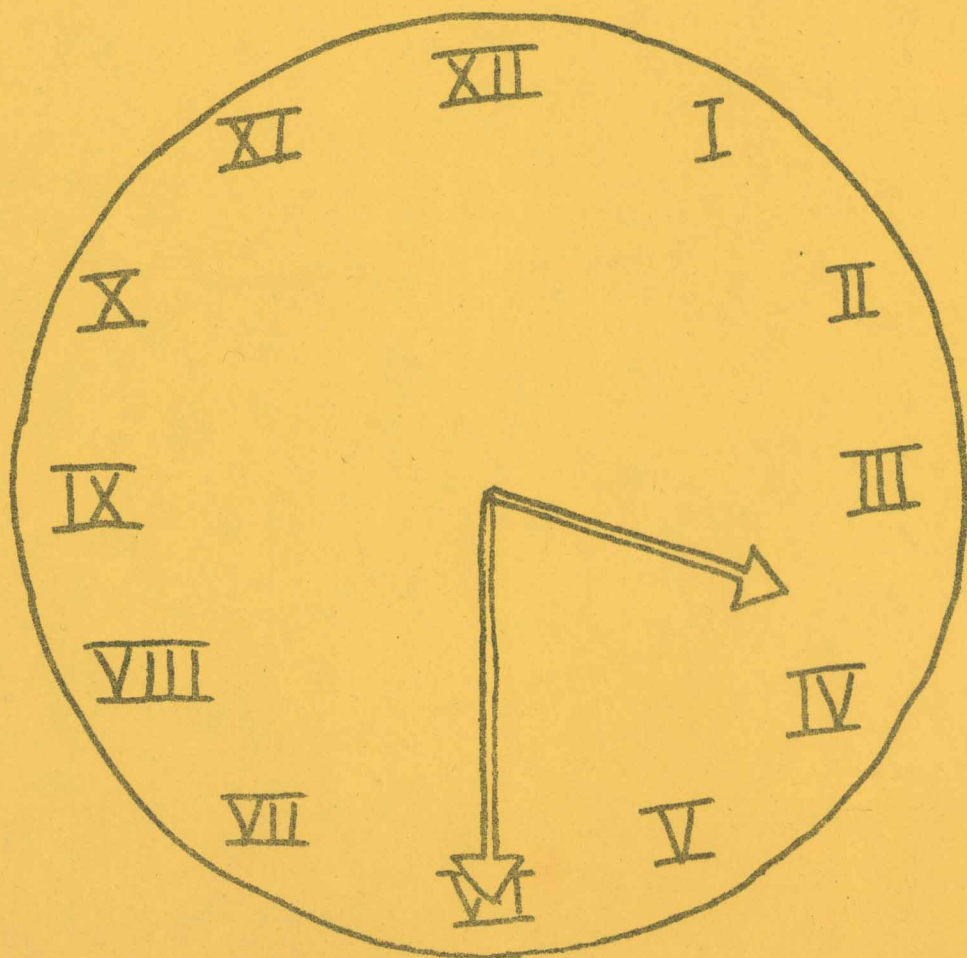

This year's sports records for Dover Middle School were pretty good overall. We had a lot of kids out for various sports. Generally the workouts were hard, but they really paid off.

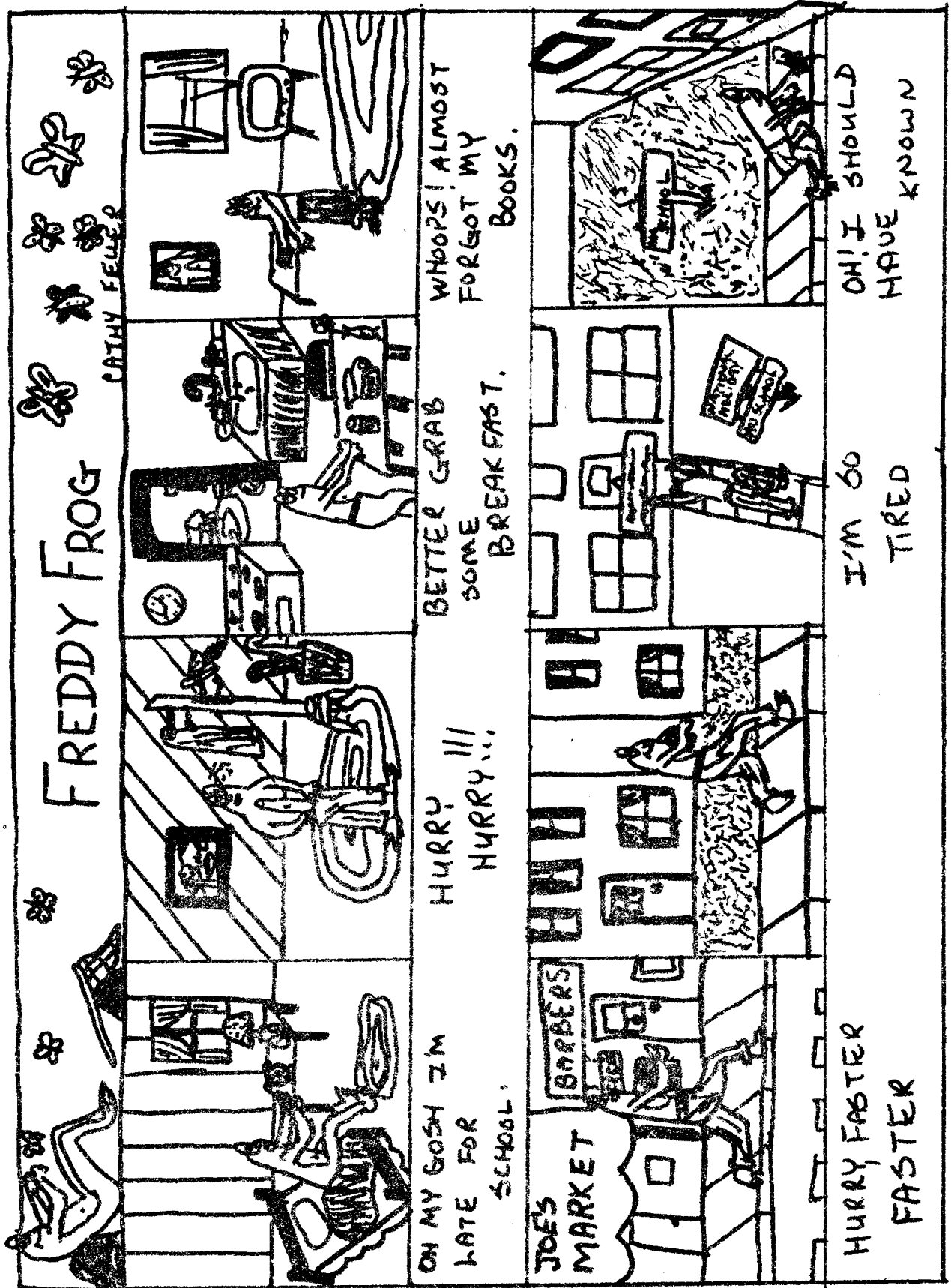
The Football A team had a record of 3-3-1, while the B team had 1 win and 5 losses. Boys Cross Country had a 4-2 record, but it changed to 22-11 when combined with invitationals. In Cross Country the girls were undefeated.

The boys eighth grade basketball A team went 15-2 and won the district championship. The 7th grade team was 3-10, and the combined B team was 3-2. The seventh-eighth grades wrestling team posted 3 victories, 2 defeats, and 1 tie, and were 4th in the Lancaster Tourney. Boys track record was 6-1; invitationals brought the record to 16-2. The girls track record was 3-4.

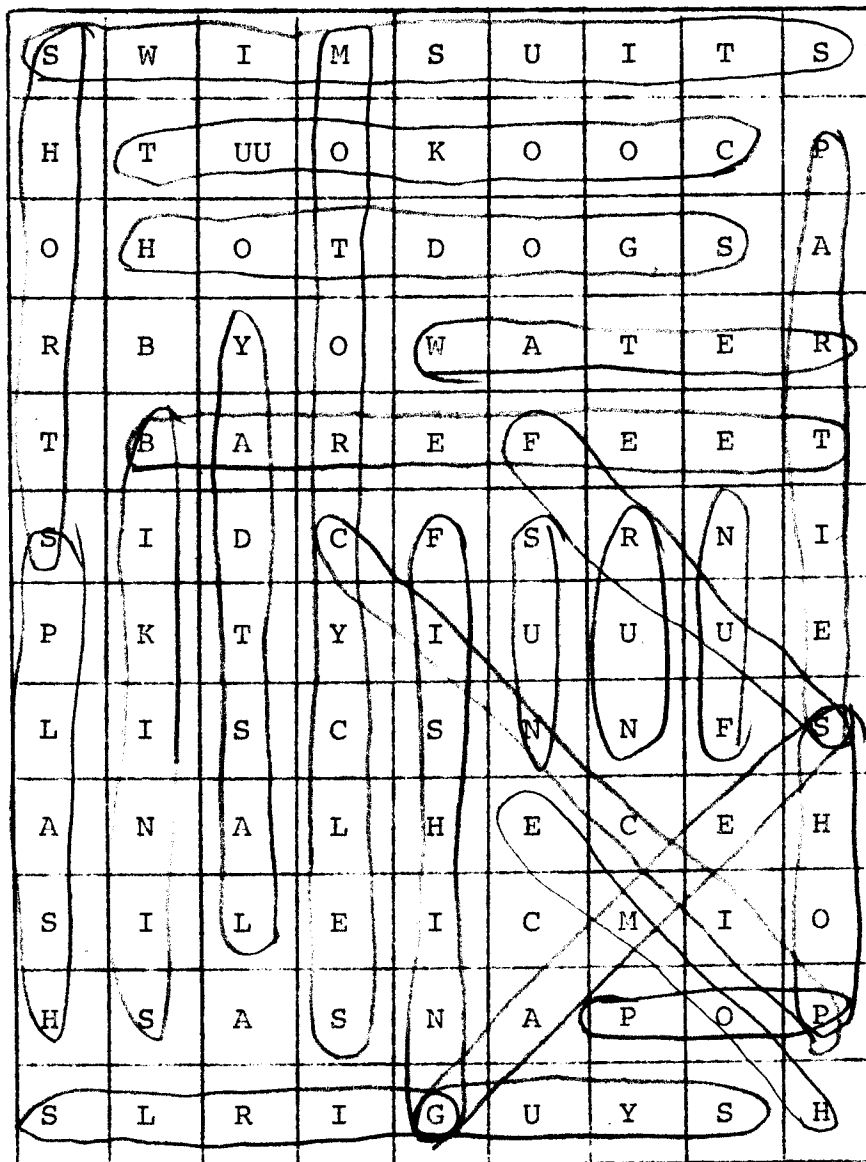

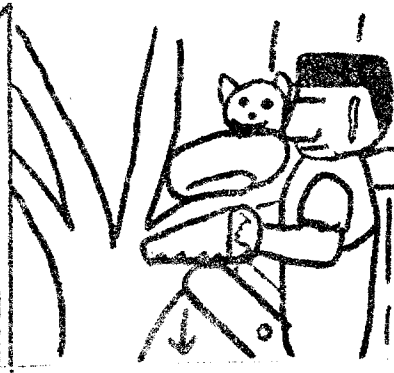

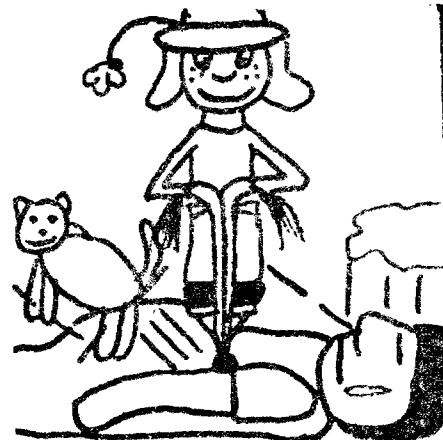
